#### Assistant Principal's Message

#### Welcome Back!

I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas and relaxing holiday. I was lovely to see our students back last week, an extra special welcome to our new Kindergarten students and those students who have joined us from other schools. We look forward to an exciting 2020!

Welcome back to all our staff, especially our new teachers; Miss Alex Toscano (KW), Mrs Trish Aumuller (4L) with Mrs Wilson, Mrs Patricia McNeil (4N) with Ms Jackman, Miss Olivia D'Accione (2N) with Ms Warby, Miss Helena Elias (2L) with Mrs Schneider, Miss Phoebe Parker (3L) with Mrs Parker and Mrs Samantha Anthony (6N) with Mr Smith.

#### **School Uniform**

Many of our students are wearing the new school uniform, which looks very smart. The children also tell me that the new uniform is much more comfortable. There is a changeover period of 2 years, so the uniform is optional for 2020 – 2021, in 2022 all children will be in the new uniform. Whichever uniform children are in, we expect them to wear them with pride. Our school colours are blue and white, which includes accessories such as ribbons, hair ties etc. A reminder that sport uniform is to be worn only on sport days or representative sport days, which will be advertised through the year. Currently we are also transitioning to a new school hat, which can be purchased only through Lowes. The school currently has a small stock of small and large sizes of the "older" version of hat. The new hats are foldable and reversible, navy on the outside and either; red, blue, green or gold on the inside, to match our sport house colours. Students need to purchase the hat that has their house colour on the inside, which can be worn on sport days as well as for any carnivals and representative sport days. These new hats will only be stocked at Lowes.

A number of students have started wearing watches that have the ability to take photos and videos. These are causing some concerns, as students are taking pictures of other students without consent, additionally these are very expensive items. As a result, we ask that these watches be kept at home.

#### **Building Update**

The new K-2 classes look absolutely beautiful, and the surrounding gardens are also growing well. All the children looked very happy in their new room and I know the teachers are also loving their new learning spaces. There are a few minor issues that are being addressed such as bags racks, which should be installed in the next few weeks and the water pressure in the bubblers. We are also looking into a tap in the infant area where children can refill their water bottles during the day to take into class.

Stage 2 of the building project has also commenced, with the demolition of the old classrooms and ground works for the new learning centre and student toilet blocks. Once demolition is finished, the construction fence will be moved to give students more space in the playground. Stage 2 is expected to take until at least July, but weather can effect completion dates – we will keep you up to date throughout the process.

#### Morning Drop-Off

We ask all parents to drop-off your child in the morning and allow them to see their friends. If your child is having trouble separating from you in the morning, please see their teacher for assistance. The best way to reduce separation anxiety is to say a quick but loving goodbye, lingering will only upset your child. If you are concerned, please call the school to see how they have settled in. I can assure you that almost all children settle very quickly once they are distracted by friends and class activities. Kindergarten children are also very excited to see their Year 6 buddies, who meet them in the mornings. Getting your child into a good morning routine, helps them to settle into school quickly.

All children are asked to drop their bags off outside their classroom, then move to the back playground or the area between the primary classrooms. In the morning, the concrete areas around the infant rooms are "out of bounds" for playing as there is no supervision. At lunch and recess, children can use this area for handball, board games, reading etc.

#### **Environmental Message**

1. Water is Precious- don't waste a drop

We are now on level 2 water restrictions.

- All hoses must have a trigger nozzle
- Outdoor watering permitted every second day before 10am and after 4pm recommended for up to 15 minutes per day (odd property number = odd date of the month, even property number = even date of the month). Outdoor watering applies to hand watering with a trigger nozzle and drip irrigation systems
- Wash vehicles and buildings with a bucket only
- Repair dripping taps and leaking toilets as quickly as possible
- No sprinklers
- No hosing of hard surfaces, except for health and safety reasons

#### **Regional Swimming Carnival**

I have the pleasure of taking a squad of 45 students to the Regional Swimming Carnival on Wednesday 12th February. Students will need to meet me at Lambton Pool (on the grass area) at 8:45am. #### Winter Trials for Sport


ST NICHOLAS OOSH


