## Assistant Principal's Message

### Kindergarten

Our delightful Kindergarten students have settled into school life beautifully. They experienced their first whole School Mass last Monday and their first Afternoon Assembly yesterday. They are to be congratulated on their excellent behaviour and manners. This week Kindergarten joins the rest of the school community for afternoon dismissal. Parents please be patient, as it might take a few minutes longer while our youngest students get used to their new routine. If a child goes to the wrong dismissal point, they will be safe with the teacher on duty, until we locate their parent. If your child does not meet you at the correct gate, come to the office and we will call their name over the speaker, usually children are not remotely concerned, it is us adults who get worried.

### Parent Teacher Interviews

The majority of parents have been able to book into see their child's teacher for an interview. Thank you to the office staff that have assisted parents who have had trouble booking interviews. In the majority of these cases, parents had lost their usernames. Please ensure you have these written somewhere safe, as we cannot give these out over the phone.

### Office of Safeguarding

#### eSafety

Schools are often asked how to safeguard children in terms of "digital safety", our advice is always to monitor very closely what your child is doing when using technology. Every year new social media sites become popular, which then results in issues for students who may have negative comments made about them, in some cases cyberbullying also occurs. The Australia Government has excellent information on the following website around safety, I encourage parents to visit this site whenever you are unsure how appropriate content is for your child <https://www.esafety.gov.au/parents>. The comments we often hear from parents are "I don't want my child to miss out", "everyone else is online", "my child has a tantrum if I refuse them screen time" and so on. Rather than worrying that our child will be left out, focus more on what you believe to be in their best interests. All social media sites have age limits for good reasons, such as inappropriate content and reduced security. Your digital footprint can NEVER be erased.

#### Wellbeing

As we settle into the school year, some children (especially in the early years) get tired and some minor separation issues may arise. The best way to deal with this is gently and in a loving manner and please talk to your child's teacher if you have any concerns. Sometimes we inadvertently tell our children we are unsure about leaving them at school; waiting outside the classroom till the bell goes and multiple hugs and kisses, tell your child you are worried about leaving them. A quick but warm goodbye, even if they are a bit upset, will help your child to settle into the routine of school quickly. Some parents have also asked if their child could call them during the school day, or giving a child a mobile phone to text during the day also gives the message that school may be an unsafe place. St Therese's is a very safe and place for all children. The occasional day that does not go to well is to be expected and perfectly normal, these days help to build children's character and resilience.

#### Mobile Phones

If your child brings a mobile phone to school, they will be asked to leave it on the teacher's desk and to pick it up in the afternoon before going home. No child is permitted to contact their parents via a mobile phone whilst at school if they are unwell, to confirm afternoon dismissal plans etc. this must all be done via the school office, for your child's safety.

#### Lotus Educational Fund needs your help!!

Those families that are new to the school may not know of the **Lotus Educational Fund** of which St Therese's is a major supporter. Lotus is a small charity formed in Newcastle over 10 years ago by an ex St Therese's teacher Dianne Gamage (who now lives/teaches in Bangkok) and Cathy Hart, local Speech Therapist and ex parent. The Lotus team now consists of various people from around the world that all volunteer their time to enable Lotus to provide opportunities and support via this charity.

The aim of Lotus is to support young girls in rural Laos to attend school and promote educational opportunities for their future. We offer a mentor program, and additional activities and support relating to the emotional, social and educational needs of the girls.



Lotus currently supports 21 year 12 girls and 32 year 7 girls over 4 small isolated rural schools. ## **RE News**

As we move toward the final Sunday of the church season of Ordinary Time before Lent, Jesus gives to us, in Matthew's Gospel, one of the greatest challenges of the Christian walk; not only to love our neighbour but to also love our enemies and to pray for those who persecute us. This is difficult for most of us to achieve as adults let alone be able to pass on and teach our children such a deeply challenging call. Nevertheless, if we are to take Jesus' words seriously and truly aim to be His followers, we must make forgiveness and compassion a way of life. This is a truly counter-cultural stance to adopt in a modern society that promotes the self ahead of others and one, where even so called Christian-founded countries and their governments are becoming more punitive and retributive in the quest to assert themselves. 'Turning the other cheek' need not mean we accept and tolerate abuse, but rather in walking away from such situations as we should that we do so with a compassionate and forgiving heart, resisting the urge to incite further troubles by seeking revenge. It can sometimes be a tough challenge, especially when our wounds are deep. But as we say and do, so often our children will follow.

Dear Parents/caregivers,

There have been some Federal Government and Catholic Schools Office (CSO) changes to our Students with Disabilities funding scheme.

All schools have now transitioned from Students with Disabilities (SWD) funding to the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD). The new data collection model has resulted in a broader range of disabilities being included in our data collection including, but not limited to, Specific Learning Disabilities (Dyslexia, Dysgraphia and Dyscalculia), Mild to Moderate Language Disorders, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADD/ADHD) and a range of Chronic Illnesses.

The new broader definition of disability has resulted in a significant increase in the number of students meeting the criteria for disability support. As a result changes have been made to the way in which schools meet with parents to collaborate and set goals for students with additional needs.

From this point forward formal Personalised Planning (PP) meetings will only be held for children requiring support at a Substantial or Extensive level. Students requiring a Supplementary level of support will have their individual needs addressed through the following channels:

- Parent Teacher Meetings (Learning Support Teacher may be present at Teacher/ Parent request)
- Email communication between the Parent and Class Teacher, Learning Support Teacher/ School Psychologist
- Phone calls
- Meetings between the parent and Class Teacher, Learning Support Teacher/ School Psychologist on a needs basis

Many of our students that once required a PP, now fall into the Supplementary level of support. Their goals, supports and strategies will continue to be documented using the Personalised Planning tool.



