Dear Students, Parents & Carers,


News from the Classroom



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






Re: Early childhood and care relief package

We welcome the Early childhood and care relief package as announced by the Prime Minister and Education Minister yesterday. The announcement of free childcare during the coronavirus pandemic brings great relief to our families, our industry as well as a level of certainty for our OOSH services.

We have been reviewing and assessing the announcement, given the payments start next week, and wanted to share with you what the package might mean for you and our services. The attached FAQ document should answer many of your questions.

Importantly, I would encourage anyone who has ceased their child's enrolment to restart. This does not mean that your child needs to attend, allowable absences can be used.

Re-starting your enrolment will hold your place in the service for that point in time when things start to normalise and you are ready to return your child to care.

As for your current account, your statement will be processed and forwarded to you, this will identify any monies outstanding as of COB Friday 3 April 2020. We will also cease automatic Direct Debits as of COB 3 April 2020 and will be in touch with you in regard to how we will be progressing with any outstanding amounts still requiring to be paid.

No further direct debits will be made on your accounts from Monday 6 April 2020 until further notice.
