I would like to thank the staff for all their time and effort in preparing for the interviews. I have had a huge number of emails and calls about how effective the interviews were. Some parents had not been able to attend the interviews in previous years, due to work commitments, so the online/phone forum allowed them an opportunity this year.

# **Building Update**

The building is coming along and inside the new centre looks amazing. It is the focal point of the school and will be used by all students, staff and parents in the coming years. Over the next two weeks we should see major changes, as the concrete is laid outside the new canteen and learning area. There is also a ramp that will lead from the lower area of the school to the canteen and infant area. Not too long to go!

The playground often floods in heavy rain, so this week a "reflux valve" is being installed outside the current learning centre, which will alleviate some of the flooding. In the next few weeks, major works will commence to upgrade our stormwater and sewer system. As this is being done as part of the current building project, there will not be any extra disruption to the playground.

The building works have had an impact on the school – both positive and negative. A positive for me, is that I have learned so much about building, and can now talk quite confidently about scope of works, swales, retention pits, reduced levels (RLs), building codes and fit outs.

# **COVID** Update

There were a few new guidelines sent out last Friday, the most important one being that children and staff who have cold and flu-like symptoms will need to have a COVID-negative test, with the results sent into school, before they can come back to school. If you have not already read the notification I sent out on Friday through Compass, please take the time to read them. We now need to distance the children on the playground, this will be done as follows for this week:

- K-2: play on the concreted area near the infant classrooms, sandpit, rock garden and infant play equipment
- Years 3 & 4: Back field + primary equipment
- Years 5 & 6: Hall and pathway outside the hall
- Infant lunch support: learning centre
- Primary lunch support: grassed area between primary classrooms

The canteen will remain open, children need to purchase their ice blocks etc. and move back to their designated play area. Children are not to go to the canteen unless they are buying something. At recess, the learning centre will also be open for children who need a quiet space, this will be organised by teachers and support staff.

We will rotate play areas each week, and I will publish these in the Newsletter as well as through Compass. Please speak to your child(ren) about their play areas, as we all need to work together to make this work, so that all children remain safe.

# **Acting Assistant Principal's Message**

# **National Child Protection Week**

Week 8 this term is National Child Protection week. Many families may recall that the students Health lessons for Weeks 8, 9 and 10 of each term are on Child Protection and working through the nine Themes of Protective Behaviours. The school will be involved in "Walk Safely to School" that week and will also do many other activities in the classrooms to ensure students know how to help keep themselves safe and who they can talk to if they need to. Students are asked to wear a <a href="white shirt on Friday 11th">white school sport shorts/skorts/skirts</a>. This day is traditionally known as White Balloon Day and so in keeping with the colour theme, but also being environmentally friendly, we ask that the students wear a white shirt to school.

#### Working Together to Keep our Students Safe

Throughout this year I have added resources available to our community via the Office Of Safeguarding department at the CSO. They have been used by many families to help keep our students and parents informed and safe. Please read the blurb below regarding Mandatory Reporting.

The Catholic Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle has an absolute and abiding commitment to promote the safety, welfare and wellbeing of children. As a parent sending your child or children to a Diocesan school, you should be aware of your rights and obligations in protecting your child and all children in our schools.

#### The Children and Young Person's (Care and Protection) Act 1998

In NSW we can report certain information to the Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ). If we are concerned for one or more of the children in the school, we can discuss our concerns with a teacher, Assistant Principal or Principal. We can report our concerns to the Child Protection Helpline (Ph. 132 111, 24 hrs/7 days) if we have reasonable grounds to suspect that a child or young person is at risk of



significant harm and our concerns are current. Risk of Significant Harm may occur from a single act or omission or to a series of acts or omissions. It is better to be safe than sorry, so if uncertain, talk to a staff member at the school.

Who Do We Say He Is? (Take some time to slow down, ask the question & reflect) - In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is putting some questions to his disciples. During these times, I may be coming to prayer with some questions of my own. I ask the Spirit to give me peace.

I may like to read and pray this Gospel imaginatively. By using my senses to place myself in the scene, I might be better able to encounter the Son of the Living God. As I read the text (Matthew 16:13-20), pondering the interactions between Jesus and the disciples, I note what is going on within me. Peter is the first to acknowledge openly that Jesus is the promised Messiah. Perhaps I am touched by his honesty, his risk.



I might now imagine Jesus posing the same question to me. How do I respond? How would I like to respond? I take my time. I ponder who Jesus is for me ... then, maybe I consider: who am I for Him? Perhaps I can ask Him directly. I wait for His response ...

Do I trust His choice of me; do I know Him well enough to trust His promises? Finally, I might feel drawn to recognise that Jesus is not someone I have to work out, but is one given by the Father. It is through revelation, God's gift to me that my happiness comes. I end with a slow sign of the cross.


