Acting Principal's Message

Dear Students, Parents & Carers,

Happy Week 8 everyone. I hope all our fathers and grandfathers had a wonderful Father's Day on Sunday, we were certainly blessed with an amazing sunny day.

Child Protection Week

This week we recognise Child Protection Week across Australia. I thank Mrs Petersen, Mrs Kepreotes and the Active Lifestyle Team, who have organised activities for the children around this important issue. Child Protection Week began in 1990, to bring childhood abuse and neglect to the attention of all. The theme for the week is "Putting Children First" when talking about parenting and caring for children. The essentials for children to grow are, being loved, feeling safe, being given the opportunity to play and explore, have a say in decisions that affect them, and have access to shelter, food, hygiene and healthcare. Children also need to know that they are being heard and they are being taken seriously. Each term in Weeks 8-10, we focus on Child Protection, by reading My Underpants Rule and discussing ways to keep our bodies safe from harm. We use the correct terminology for our body parts, and encourage parents/carers to do this also, to avoid confusion a child is to tell a teacher or staff member about any inappropriate behaviours. We also discuss being proactive with our own safety and to listen to what our bodies are telling us when we feel unsafe e.g. butterflies in the tummy, feeling nervous, being afraid etc. Talking with your child about stranger danger and who to go to for help when in an unfamiliar place, are vital lessons for your child, from a very young age. In today's world, we also need to focus on eSafety. An excellent for parents resources site to go https://www.esafety.gov.au/parents.

While we do not want to unnecessarily frighten are children, we want to ensure they have the skills and knowledge to keep themselves safe. Please take the time this week to ask your child what they have been doing at school and open the conversation with them around child protection. All school staff are mandatory reporters, which means that if a child discloses any abuse or neglect, we are required by law, to report this to the Office of Safeguarding at the Catholic Schools Office. School staff also receive annual professional learning, to identify signs of abuse and neglect in children and are then supported
