## **Acting Assistant Principal's Message**

#### 2020/2021 ASPIRE

Traditionally, Stage 3 students have been involved in an ASPIRE excursion to the Civic Theatre, this year it is a little different and instead we will be watching the production via a screening session for all Stage 3 in February at school. There is however, a chance for families to a part of the studio audience in 2020. Below are some dates and times that may interest our school community and allows you to become a part of the 'studio audience' experience.

#### Thursday 11 February – Times to be determined by schools

An opportunity for all Catholic schools within the Diocese to enjoy ASPIRE's 2020 production, *The Pecking Order*, and celebrate the achievements of its cast and crew in sharing this original story. St Therese's will invite all students in Stage 3 to settle down in the school hall, or their classrooms, to enjoy the screening of this theatre production.

#### Tickets \$20 per person per session

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, ASPIRE has adapted the way it is to deliver its 2021 production, *The Pecking Order*. Normally a large-scale production with over 150 young people involved across six ensembles, ASPIRE is creating a filmed version of the original show. Each of the performance ensembles will have their own day of filming in the Civic Theatre in front of a live audience. The audience will be talked through the plot of the show as we go by cast members. The filmed individual ensembles production will then be cut together and screened at the Civic Theatre on 6 February 2021.

#### Individual days available for the ASPIRE Studio Audience Experience

<u>Saturday 16 January 2021: Recording Music at the Civic Theatre at 1pm (finish time approx. 4pm)</u>
Be part of the live studio audience for the ASPIRE stage band sessions. Watch as the band perform the music from the production 'The Pecking Order' as it is professionally recorded in readiness for later studio audience sessions for dance and vocal ensembles. This is a unique opportunity to see ASPIRE's talented young musicians front and centre as they take over the Civic Theatre Stage.

<u>Tuesday 19 January: Recording Humans at the Civic Theatre at 1pm (finish time approx. 5pm)</u>
Join the human characters of the Pecking Order as we film their scenes and songs in a special live studio audience event. This event involves Junior Drama and Vocal ensembles as well as lead characters from the Senior Vocal Ensemble. Join them all at 'Camp Capacity' a leadership camp run by Cash Vanity – leadership guru and egocentric entrepreneur as they learn about what makes a good leader and challenge their preconceptions.

# Wednesday 20 January: Recording Bird Song at the Civic Theatre at 1pm (finish time approx. 5pm)

• Be entertained by a flock encompassing Rainbow Lorikeets, Fairy Wrens and Mynah Birds as they sing and dance their way through the bird related repertoire of *The Pecking Order*. This event showcases our dance and senior vocal ensembles who will dazzle with their beautiful bird song and fancy flying.

# Thursday 21 January: Recording talking birds at the Civic Theatre at 1pm (finish time approx. 5pm)

Munch the Magpie is desperate to be leader of the flock, but when will it be her turn? Join ASPIRE's senior drama ensemble as they portray the most eclectic flock of birds in Australia. Follow the birds as they negotiate their relationship with the humans and find that in times of adversity, every member of the flock is vital.

#### Sunday 7 February at 1pm and 6pm



This is it! It is my turn; it has to be!' Munch the Magpie is desperate to be leader of the flock, but it seems like everyone else gets picked over her all the time. However, when members of the flock start to disappear will Munch have what it takes to save her friends? Featuring a host of colourful characters of both the avian and human variety, *The Pecking Order* asks what makes a great leader and encourages us to embrace people's differences. Filmed over the course of a week at the Civic Theatre this is an opportunity to see the complete version of ASPIRE's original production for 2020 on the big screen in the beautiful Civic Theatre.

#### **RE News**

Papal Encyclical – 'Fratelli Tutti' (Brothers & Sisters All): This week we continue to explore the teachings of the papal encyclical, Fratelli Tutti, concerning Pope Francis' call to a more universal fraternity and social friendship amongst humanity. The following excerpt, taken from; <a href="https://www.vaticannews.va/en/pope/news/2020-10/fratelli-tutti-pope-fraternity-social-friendship-short-summary.html">https://www.vaticannews.va/en/pope/news/2020-10/fratelli-tutti-pope-fraternity-social-friendship-short-summary.html</a>, gives a concise summary of the encyclical's fourth chapter titled, "A Heart Open to the Whole World":

To the theme of migration, the chapter, entitled "A heart open to the whole world": With their lives "at stake" (Par 37), fleeing from war, persecution, natural catastrophes, unscrupulous trafficking, ripped from their communities of origin, migrants are to be welcomed, protected, supported and integrated. Unnecessary migration needs to be avoided, the Pontiff affirms, by creating concrete opportunities to live with dignity in the countries of origin. But at the same time, we need to respect the right to seek a better life elsewhere. In receiving countries, the right balance will be between the protection of citizens' rights and the guarantee of welcome and assistance for migrants (see Par 38-40). Specifically, the Pope points to several "indispensable steps, especially in response to those who are fleeing grave humanitarian crises": to increase and simplify the granting of visas; to open humanitarian corridors; to assure lodging, security and essential services; to offer opportunities for employment and training; to favour family reunification; to protect minors; to guarantee religious freedom. What is needed above all – the document reads – is global governance, an international collaboration for migration which implements long-term planning, going beyond single emergencies, on behalf of the supportive development of all peoples (see Par 129-132).

Food for thought as we consider our own country's current policies and practices in regards to immigration and refugees. Please see the Term 4, Week 1 Newsletter containing links to the full encyclical and other sites which give insight and understanding into its teachings.

Please note: Parents who order through LOOP online from Friday 27th November will be offered a home delivery option for a fee.


Do not miss out!
