#### **Acting Principal's Message**

#### **Building Update**

The children have enjoyed more playing space, as some of the new paved area outside the Catherine McAuley Centre opened last week. The concrete to remaining areas will be finished this week.

In the next few weeks, Hunter Water will commence works in Burke St, to upgrade the water mains. Currently, the new pipes from the school are larger than the mains under Burke St, as Hunter Water incorrectly advised the engineers of the diameter of the water mains. This upgrade should not affect the school, but may alter traffic slightly on Burke St. All parents will be given notice of any changes to Burke St well in advance, please keep an eye on Compass for further details.

#### **End of Year Celebrations**

We are planning our end of year celebrations, and due to COVID guidelines, these will involve only students and staff. All the award ceremonies will be broadcast via live streaming, so parents, grandparents etc. can access these from home. #### **Discovering Potential Across all Key Learning Areas**

#### **RE News**


<u>Assembly Liturgies & Advent</u> – Although Advent does not officially begin until Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> November and, as a general rule, we usually follow the previous Sunday's Gospel in our assembly liturgies, in order to ensure we cover most of the Advent Gospel themes, we will start our school Advent liturgies during this Friday's Zoom assembly (27<sup>th</sup> Nov). All grades are currently covering the Advent & Christmas seasons within the curriculum content of Religious Education.

<u>Papal Encyclical</u> – *'Fratelli Tutti'* (Brothers & Sisters All): This week we continue to explore the teachings of the papal encyclical, Fratelli Tutti, concerning Pope Francis' call to a more universal fraternity and social friendship amongst humanity. The theme of the fifth chapter is "A better kind of politics", which represents one of the most valuable forms of charity because it is placed at the service of the common good (see Par 180) and recognizes the importance of people. Better politics is also one that protects work, an "essential dimension of social life". The task of politics, moreover, is to find a solution to all that attacks fundamental human rights, such as social exclusion; the marketing of organs, tissues, weapons and drugs; sexual exploitation; slave labour; terrorism and organized crime. The Pope makes an emphatic appeal to definitively eliminate human trafficking, a "source of shame for humanity", and hunger, which is "criminal" because food is "an inalienable right" (Par 188-189). The politics we need, Francis also underscores, is a politics centred on human dignity and not subjected to finance because "the marketplace, by itself, cannot resolve every problem".

# Good for Kids good for life

## TRADITIONAL INDIGENOUS GAMES



#### Background

In areas of north Queensland, a game of throwing skill was played. A large bone, such as an emu shinbone, with twine attached to it was thrown in to a pit or hole.

#### Short description

The game involves throwing a ball into a small bin target as many times as possible.

#### Equipment

- Use 'foxtall' or a tennis ball in a stocking (or long football sock) as the bone.
- Use a large plastic bin or hoop as the pit or hole.

#### Game play and basic rules

- Play singly or in groups of two to four players.
- Players line up behind one another in their groups.
- Players hold the foxtall a short distance away from the ball and take it in turns to attempt to throw the foxtall ball in to the bin or hoop from 3-5 metres away.
- To avoid interference, the player throwing the footall is 2 metres in front of the rest
  of the line of players (mark a line for this)
- As an extra challenge, the balls are held further down the tall.

#### Scoring

- Players can keep score of successful throw for a set time (2-3 minutes) or set number of tums (four to sk).
- If using a hoop, score one point if the foxfall touches or bounces in and out of the hoop, and two points if it stays in the hoop.
