# Principal's Message

**Dear Parents** 

2021 has started at a fast pace. Covid-19 is still with us and we are all unsure of what to expect next. What I can tell you is that the children have settled well into the school year and are already working hard.

Next week parents will have an opportunity to meet with teachers to discuss your child's needs. I encourage all of you to take this opportunity to get to know your child's teacher. You can have either a zoom or face to face meeting. Please make sure you let your child's teacher know what is best for you.

As always afternoon pickup is a problem. I want to remind everyone that in Burke Street children are dismissed in alphabetical order that is surnames A-L at 3.15pm to 3.25pm and M-Z 3.25pm to 3.30pm. If you are running late don't panic a teacher will remain with you child until you arrive anyone arriving after 3.45pm will need to pick their child up from the front office. Can I also ask parents that if your child is picked up by a grandparent tell not to arrive at school at 2.30pm and block up the road. No child will be dismissed early, and all children will be supervised so there is no need to rush for pick up.

As we have already had a near miss at Bridges Road lights the police have been called. Be aware of the road rules and your obligations and responsibility to ensure the safety of the children.



# **Assistant Principal's Message**

### **Welcome to Kindergarten**

Last Tuesday our delightful Kindergarten children started school. They all looked so excited in their new uniforms, with the highlight of their day being settling into their new classrooms and meeting their buddy. We are looking forward to greeting to know each child, their interests and their talents.

# **Parent/Teacher Interviews**

Parent/Teacher (PT) Meetings will be held in Week 4 for Years 1-6 and Week 6 for Kindergarten. The purpose of these meetings, is for you and your child's teacher to discuss your child's strengths, areas of concern and then to plan academic, social and emotional goals for your child. These meetings will be "face-to-face" in your child's classroom with their teacher. If you have children in a job-share class, you will meet with the teacher that is teaching on class the day of your interview. For job-share classes, only one teacher is listed to for an interview. We are looking forward to meeting parents onsite this year, however if you cannot attend a meeting onsite, Zoom or phone meetings will also be available. Please do not book back-to-back meetings with teachers, if you have more than one child enrolled at school, as this may lead to meetings going overtime, which inconveniences other parents. To book a PT Meeting, please go to Compass and open your child's profile. There will be a blue link on the right side of the screen, that leads you to the booking sheet. Booking with be open from Tuesday 9 February 3:00pm until Friday 12 February 4:00pm. When you book the interviews, you will be given the location of the meeting and whether your child's teacher will be doing alternate Zoom or phone interviews.

Kindergarten bookings will be opened following the Kindergarten Parent Information Evening, as we will demonstrate how to navigate through Compass.

Children who have Personalised Planning (PP) Meetings, will have their meetings in Week 5 (Years K-2). These will also be booked through Compass with bookings open from <u>Tuesday 9 February 3:00pm</u> <u>until Friday 12 February 4:00pm</u>. Child who have a PP meeting do <u>not</u> need a PT Meeting as well. We are looking forward to meeting you all at school, so that you can also see our beautiful school setting, now that the building works have been completed.



#### Safe Dismissal of Students

St Therese's is a large school, so we ask all parents/guardians for your cooperation to keep all our students safe, especially during afternoon dismissal. Afternoon dismissal is at 3:15pm, so please do not arrive earlier.

<u>Burke St</u> Last week we had a "near miss" at the corner of Burke St and Bridges Rd, as cars ran the red light as children and parents/guardians were crossing at the pedestrian crossing. In conversations with the police, the issue continues to be a gridlock on Bridges Rd each afternoon, as parents start to arrive as early as 2:30pm to pick up children from Burke St. The end of the school day is 3:15pm and children are not dismissed until this time, we also have staggered dismissal to try to further alleviate this gridlock. Children with surnames from A-L are dismissed from 3:15 – 3:25pm and children with surnames from M-Z will be dismissed from 3:25pm (this will be alternated each term). Please do not arrive earlier than your designated time, as this causes unnecessary confusion and long lines that cause major disruptions on Bridges Rd and to all our neighbours.

<u>William St</u> This dismissal point has become very busy, resulting in numerous complaints from neighbours at the end of last year, as well as into this year. Parents are double parked and parked across driveways, again, from as early as 2:30pm. Parents are also remaining on William St to talk to other parents. To alleviate some of the congestion, parents/guardians are encouraged to look at Royal St an alternative pick-up point.

Each afternoon almost all students are dismissed from the school by 3:30pm. The safety of the children is our priority, so we ask all parents/guardians to work with us and exercise some patience each afternoon.

## **Change to Volunteering at School**

Please note that the procedure for volunteering at schools in the Diocese has changed.

All volunteers are required to have a National Police Check (NPC) registered and full clearance to be approved by the Catholic Schools Office.

In the latest Volunteer Induction Handbook (version 1.5), there is a Statutory Screening Selection Tool for Volunteers in Schools.

Each volunteer is required to complete this form which will determine if a Working with Children's Check is required (now only required for overnight camps if you are a close relative).

The instructions regarding identification and obtaining the NPC have also changed and this is also included in the handbook. The handbook is available on the school website or from Admin office.

Any volunteer that has already completed the NPC last year are still cleared to volunteer, however everyone else will need to resubmit their handbook and receive clearance.

We appreciate that there have been many changes over the last few years regarding this process and ask that if you have any questions regarding this matter to speak to the ladies in the front office.

# **The Mystery Music Table**

Those classes who have come to the performing arts centre this week will have been introduced to a new listening initiative called "The Mystery Music Table". The aim of the initiative is to get families talking and learning about music at home. Every second week, I will be placing visual clues on the table. Try to link them together to guess a particular musical focus.

I have made the first table idea an obvious one – The Beatles. On the photo below you will see a picture of the Beatles who are from Liverpool in the UK (as indicated by the jersey and stamps). The Lego people on the street backdrop is a portrayal of their very famous album cover Abbey Road.



So, what's the point? As you link the clues together, use it as a family opportunity to chat about the music at home. Listen to their music, find out who they were, where did they come from? Pull out albums, CDs, tapes, records.

Parents and grandparents, share your stories about the Beatles if you have any – your favourite song, did you get a chance to see them, did you watch their cartoon series growing up etc? One student told me their parents have around 16 Beatles albums. I shared my own story with the students. My singing teacher (from my teenage years) was unable to leave his hotel room in Melbourne in 1964 because of

the thousands of screaming fans who surrounded his hotel. I loved putting his story into context when I found an actual photo of the event online. Bought back wonderful memories of a teacher I really loved.

Music is a powerful force that links generations together. I'd love you and the students to use this as an opportunity to share your knowledge and experiences, to open our students' minds and ears to the world of music, and for you to share music together as a family. I really hope you enjoy this initiative. I look forward to sharing the next table clues with you in week 4.

The program is a new local creative based on Contemporary dialogue (see below for explanation) that has been designed as an opportunity to gather together and discuss the Five Foundations that the Diocese functions on.

- Identity and Community

- Leadership and Structure

Each week during Lent you are encouraged to immerse yourself in the range of resources. You are invited to connect with community across your school

Contemplative dialogue leads to a shared understanding, we listen from an inner silence that creates a space where something new can emerge. Our intention is to move beyond the personal as we probe significant ideas together and listen deeply for truth in another's point of view. 
