News from the Performing Arts Centre

The Mystery Music Table

What a great response we had from so many children across the school, telling me and others about what they have learnt about The Beatles. I hope you continue to chat and listen to their music. So many stories were of the children connecting with grandparents and their memories of being a teenager in the 60s. What a great way to connect generations together through music. One student gave me two pages of homework she had completed with her dad. Such great work.

Please find below the clues for our next table. Its inspiration comes from a comment made by a young man from Stage Three who challenged me to think about other music "legends". I questioned him about what he meant, and he could clearly articulate the kind of artists he was thinking of.

Have a look at the clues and see if you can make the link to "Female Music Legends". The clues are links to the following famous artists – Celine Dion, Kylie Minogue, Beyonce, Diana Ross, and some of my favourites – Adele, Kate Bush, Aretha Franklin, Ella Fitzgerald and Whitney Houston. As I was doing the research for this table, it struck me just how many great soloists are out there. I would have liked to put so many more clues on the table.

Here are some suggestions on how you can engage in finding out about famous female soloists:

- ask your grown-ups at home about famous female singers, who were their favourites, do your grown-ups have their albums, did they ever get a chance to see them perform at a concert?
- \cdot look up the top 100 female artists, and if you're interested, look at artists outside of the pop genre.
- explore playlists of top female artists and think about what you like about their music, voices, and style of singing.
- \cdot choose an artist you like and try to learn how to sing one of their songs.

I have already had a few people within the school approach me about their favourite singers. One young lady from Stage Three told me how she knew a lot of Dolly Parton songs (she could even sing difficult passages of lyrics for me).



I wonder what you might discover this week. Have fun everyone and keep on listening to music.

OOSH St Nicholas

Hello to everyone from St Nicholas OOSH New Lambton

Last week we conducted our emergency evacuation and lock down drills. Overall the children and staff did really well but there is always room for improvement. This can be a new experience for many of our new kindergarten children but they are proving to be a very resilient group. The number of children attending OOSH is growing all the time with some mornings seeing more than 80 children and up to 120 on some afternoons. In light of this, last week we trialled splitting the group in to seniors and juniors with the seniors having afternoon tea and playing in the hall and the juniors in the OOSH room. This proved to work really well allowing the children easier access to afternoon tea and more room to play and relax. Please keep this in mind when you are collecting your children. If your child is at the hall it may take an extra few minutes for them to gather their bag and get back to the OOSH room.

Serious Traffic Management Concerns

Near Miss Incidents

There have been two serious near miss incidents reported to St Therese's Primary School, New Lambton. The first near miss occurred on 29th May 2020 and the second near miss occurred on 3th February 2021.

Both these incidents occurred at the Bridges Road pedestrian crossing and resulted in near collisions with pedestrians attempting to cross at the pedestrian crossing. Traffic becomes congested as parents/carers are attempting to turn left into Burke Street to collect their children at the end of the school day.

Parents/carers are queuing in the left hand lane of Bridges Road waiting to turn left into Burke Street, quite often this queue extends across the pedestrian crossing as per the images below — this congestion results in other road users becoming frustrated, overtaking and not observing the traffic lights and pedestrians crossing.





Actions Taken

St Therese's Primary School has a staggered dismissal process in place to alleviate the congestion and gridlock on Bridges Road, however, parents/carers have disregarded the process which has resulted in the above near miss incidents. The school Traffic Management Plan has been provided to parents/carers and reminders are frequently publicised in the school newsletter. Police and Local Council have been engaged to monitor the area but this is not sustainable on a daily basis when school is operational.

Further Recommended Actions

Should an incident occur, the impact will have far reaching and long term effects on the school and community.

The Catholic Diocese Maitland Newcastle 'Safety & Wellness Team' are urging parents/carers to strictly adhere to the school Traffic Management Plan to keep the school community and other pedestrians safe from harm.

If the school is unable to maintain a safe process for the collection of children after school, it could lead to cancellation of this service (meaning that parents/carers would have to find a park for their car and walk to the school to collect their children).



Premiers reading challenge

The PRC is a state-wide program which encourages students to read a certain number of books with the aim to foster a love of reading for pleasure. A suggested book list provides students with the opportunity to experience quality literature.

The challenge runs from the 1st March to 20th August 2021. Every student who completes the PRC will receive a commemorative certificate from the Premier.

K-2 children are automatically enrolled and will complete the challenge in class with their teacher and in the library.

Children in Years 3-6 take ownership of their own reading. Any primary aged children wishing to complete the challenge <u>will need to add their name to the list displayed in their classroom.</u> They will then be provided with their username and password.
