# **Assistant Principal's Message**

# **Assembly**

We will resume live assemblies in the School Hall, on <u>Monday 17 May at 2:30pm</u>. We will no longer hold Zoom assemblies on Friday afternoon, the liturgy, awards and messages will now take place at the Monday assembly. We moved to Monday afternoons, as Mr Howard Ward is available on Monday afternoons to conduct our talented band. Band lessons will continue on Tuesday, so all band members will need to bring their instruments on Monday and Tuesday. The band can leave their instruments at school on Monday afternoon. I thank Howard for his commitment to St Therese's band. Each Monday, Howard teaches all day at another school, then will be at our assembly. We look forward to welcoming all parents and families back onsite each Monday for assembly. Please ensure you sign in each week, as this is a COVID Safe requirement.

#### **Sickness**

We remind all parents/guardians to keep your children at home if they are unwell. As the weather is cooling down, we have had so many children with cold and flu symptoms such as coughing, sneezing, sore throat and mildly elevated temperatures. Everyone who is experiencing cold and flu like symptoms are required to stay at home until recovered and a negative COVID result needs to be forwarded to school.

Children and adults with gastrointestinal symptoms such as vomiting and diarrhoea, are required to stay at home for <u>24-hours</u> after symptoms resolve. This is advice from NSW Health to ensure the risk of spreading germs is reduced.

We continue to practice good hygiene at school, such as washing hands before and after eating, after using the toilet and after sneezing and coughing. Please continue to reinforce this with your children.

# **Aerobics Competition**

Due to the COVID hotspots in Sydney last week, the Aerobics Competition was cancelled, instead schools were asked to have their students perform within the school and a video taken to send to the judges for feedback. # Continuum of School Improvement External Review (COSI)

The COSI process, in a 6-year cycle involving yearly reviews of different areas of the school, an internal review in year 3 and an external review in year 6. This year, St Therese's will complete the external review. A COSI team of staff comprising of a teacher from each stage, learning support teacher, learning support assistant and clerical staff, have met to review our current focus areas then plan for future directions in Catholic Identity, teaching & learning, management & organisation. On the 7-8 June, a panel of four from the Catholic Schools Office will be at St Therese's to go through the review, observe life at St Therese's and talk to staff, students and parents about their experiences at St Therese's. We are looking for 8-12 parents/guardians to be a part of this process. It will involve a conversation with the CSO review team and will be held at St Therese's. 

## Benjamin Britten's Noyes Fludde - A Feast of Sound and Vision

In May Newcastle Youth Orchestra is presenting Benjamin Britten's well-known children's opera *Noyes Fludde* (Noah's Flood). *Noyes Fludde*, completed in December 1957 and first performed during the 1958 Aldeburgh Festival, is his most extended and elaborate work for children.

Britten's unerring skill in seamlessly integrating these various elements with musical invention of a consistently high quality is undoubtedly one of his finest achievements while the church setting, and general method of presentation clearly point the way forward to the 'Church Parables' of the 1960s.

Under the direction of Ghillian Sullivan the production will feature over 110 performers, including a 55-piece orchestra, conducted by Dr Ian Cook. The cast will be led by Sydney-based baritone Robert McDougall as *Noye* and mezzo soprano Kathryn Dries as *Mrs Noye*. Robert performed in the recent production of *Chess* at the Civic Theatre as Walter. Newcastle Youth Orchestra will combine with students from Julie Logan Music and Avondale Conservatorium to present this feast of incredible music. Our production of *Noyes Fludde* is a great family show suitable for all ages. The approximate length of the performance is 1 hour ten minutes.

## Information Sheet for Parents / Carers

This document provides important information for parents and carers who are considering requesting that NDIS-funded services are delivered to their child while at school.

There are four key steps for parents and carers to follow when seeking to have NDIS-funded services delivered in the school:

- . Step 1: ask the school in writing
- Step 2: meet with school staff to discuss details
- Step 3: your school Principal will consider your request
- · Step 4: if agreed, the Contractor will need to meet the screening requirements

Catholic schools within the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle and the National Disability Insurance Agency recommend that therapy services funded through a child's NDIS support plan are best delivered outside of school time. This allows the school to focus on teaching your child and all other students and ensures your child does not miss out on important learning. In some cases, however, it may be more suitable for these services to be provided at school.

If this is the case, the school Principal will manage these services in a way that does not affect your child's opportunity to take part in class. It is important that your child does not miss out on important learning and school programs because they are receiving therapy services.

The Principal will also make sure that the school is able to run to benefit all students without undue disruption to learning.

How to request the service for your child to be provided at school

- Complete and submit the Application for a Category 5 Contractor to Provide Services to a Student in a Diocesan School form to the school.
- The Principal, or his/her delegate will contact you to organise a meeting to discuss your request. Please note that this may form part of your usual planning meetings with the school in relation to your child's learning and support. You may wish to invite the contractor to the meeting or include them in the discussion.
  - NB: Schools will not meet any costs for contractors to attend meetings at school.
- 3. Bring all relevant documents and information to the meeting. This may include reports from specialists, therapists or, your child's NDIS support plan. The meeting will help the Principal to consider whether providing the service at school will fit with your child's personalised learning and support provisions and the operational arrangements at the school. This might include discussion of the times when the service would be provided.

The Principal will then need time to consider your request. A Contractor will not be able to work in a school before approval has been given by the Principal. If the Principal agrees to the service being delivered at school, the school will advise you.
