#### **Assistant Principal's Message**

#### Year 6 Camp

It was an absolute pleasure to take Year 6 to the Collaroy Centre for camp last week. Every child, participated in activities enthusiastically, with some activities being quite daunting – I have yet to tackle the Absailing Wall. While many of the children were nervous at first, they all overcame their fear, their faces showed their joy and pride in themselves. The children's support of their peers and ability to work as a team, was also so heart-warming to observe. The staff at the Collaroy Centre remarked on the children's beautiful manners and overall behaviour. They really were a credit to themselves and the teachers and I were extremely proud of all the children. I know I speak for Mr Smith, Mr Moore, Mrs Anthony and Mrs Griffiths when I say that the teachers had just as much fun as the children.

#### Lost Property

Over the weekend I washed 2 baskets of jumpers and jackets that did not have any names on them. These will now be placed in the Second hand Clothing Pool. Please label all your children's belongings: lunch boxes, drink bottles, hats, clothes etc. it is very difficult to return lost items to children if they are unlabelled.

#### Continuum of School Improvement External Review (COSI)

The COSI process, in a 6-year cycle involving yearly reviews of different areas of the school, an internal review in year 3 and an external review in year 6. This year, St Therese's will complete the external review. A COSI team of staff comprising of a teacher from each stage, learning support teacher, learning support assistant and clerical staff, have met to review our current focus areas then plan for future directions in Catholic Identity, teaching & learning, management & organisation. On the 7-8 June, a panel of four from the Catholic Schools Office will be at St Therese's to go through the review, observe life at St Therese's and talk to staff, students and parents about their experiences at St Therese's. We are looking for 8-12 parents/guardians to be a part of this process. It will involve a conversation with the CSO review team and will be held at St Therese's. This conversation will take approximately 1 hour and I hope to organise it at 9:00am or 2:15pm to coincide with drop off and pick up.

#### Office of Safeguarding OoSG

Each week in the Newsletter, we will include information, to help parents with ideas to ensure the safety of their children. This information is to assist parents/guardians with issues around safeguarding children. In the media over the weekend, there were many stories about the objectifying of teenagers, through the posting of inappropriate photographs. These photographs may be of inappropriate poses or while wearing revealing clothing, and are often "selfies". In primary aged children, we see posts to TikTok, and similar social media sites, of very suggestive and inappropriate dancing. To protect your child, please ensure they use their device in a public area of your home and you are aware of their online behaviours. We also suggest the following:

- Children do not keep any device in their bedroom overnight where they can be disturbed by notifications
- Parents have the passwords for all social media sites their child has access to
- Children are only using sites that are appropriate for their age group.




# **Speed Cubing Competition!**

#### Information Sheet for Parents / Carers

This document provides important information for parents and carers who are considering requesting that NDIS-funded services are delivered to their child while at school.

There are four key steps for parents and carers to follow when seeking to have NDIS-funded services delivered in the school:

- . Step 1: ask the school in writing
- Step 2: meet with school staff to discuss details
- Step 3: your school Principal will consider your request
- · Step 4: if agreed, the Contractor will need to meet the screening requirements

Catholic schools within the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle and the National Disability Insurance Agency recommend that therapy services funded through a child's NDIS support plan are best delivered outside of school time. This allows the school to focus on teaching your child and all other students and ensures your child does not miss out on important learning. In some cases, however, it may be more suitable for these services to be provided at school.

If this is the case, the school Principal will manage these services in a way that does not affect your child's opportunity to take part in class. It is important that your child does not miss out on important learning and school programs because they are receiving therapy services.

The Principal will also make sure that the school is able to run to benefit all students without undue disruption to learning.

How to request the service for your child to be provided at school

- Complete and submit the Application for a Category 5 Contractor to Provide Services to a Student in a Diocesan School form to the school.
- The Principal, or his/her delegate will contact you to organise a meeting to discuss your request. Please note that this may form part of your usual planning meetings with the school in relation to your child's learning and support. You may wish to invite the contractor to the meeting or include them in the discussion.
  - NB: Schools will not meet any costs for contractors to attend meetings at school.
- 3. Bring all relevant documents and information to the meeting. This may include reports from specialists, therapists or, your child's NDIS support plan. The meeting will help the Principal to consider whether providing the service at school will fit with your child's personalised learning and support provisions and the operational arrangements at the school. This might include discussion of the times when the service would be provided.

The Principal will then need time to consider your request. A Contractor will not be able to work in a school before approval has been given by the Principal. If the Principal agrees to the service being delivered at school, the school will advise you.
