# Assistant Principal's Message

#### **COSI External Review**

Yesterday and today, we have been joined by a team from the Catholic School Office (CSO), to look at life at St Therese's. All schools within our Diocese go through a cyclical review process that occurs over a 6 year period. The CSO uses two documents that help set the strategic planning and School Improvement Plan for schools: The Catholic Identity Improvement Tool (CIIT) and the National Schools Improvement Tool (NSIT). Over the past 6 years, St Therese's have focused on Faith Life, Systematic Curriculum Delivery and Effective Pedagogical Practices. We will continue to focus on these, as well as developing our staff understanding around analysis and discussion of data. I would like to thank the following staff that have been part of our review team over the past two terms: Miss Toscano, Mrs McNeill, Mrs Sturt, Mrs Brymora, Mrs McSpadden, Mrs Lunn & Mr Smith. I would also like to thank the parents, students and staff who participated in the interviews with the CSO Team, and the classes that welcomed the Team into their rooms to see the exciting learning experiences at St Therese's.

The school leadership team and staff will now look at the recommendations of the CSO Team, which will be communicated to parents in due course.

#### Safeguarding our Students

All classes K-6 have engaged in the "Protective Behaviours Unit" as part of their Personal Development and Health lessons. Each term children complete this unit, and the book <u>My Underpants Rule</u> by Rod Power is read in all classes. This unit focuses on giving our children the strategies that will ensure they keep themselves safe, in all situations. Part of this process is that teachers and children use the correct terminology for their body parts, which empowers children to feel comfortable talking about their bodies and telling parents and trusted adults if they feel unsafe or are being hurt by others.

#### Reconciliation Week - Where to Now?...

Last week we celebrated Reconciliation Week 2021 with a beautiful liturgy during our Monday assembly. We were honoured to have two of our Education Officers from the CSO, Louise Campbell & Craig Duncan, in attendance. As an avid AFL supporter, I personally always love this time of the year too where all games during this round (known as the - Sir Doug Nicholls Round) are preceded by an Acknowledgment of Country, Indigenous culture and contributions, not just to the sport but to Australian culture at large. All of the clubs wear beautifully designed jumpers made especially for this round, the designs of each telling a specific story.

I can't help but get the feeling though, like many similar initiatives – Laudato Si Week, Walk-to-Work (both are about being better environmental stewards), that occasions like these come and then often drift off into the background until the same time next year. For the sake of peace, healing and so many other benefits to this nation, on this occasion I hope not. In fact, I believe if we were to continue giving greater honour and privilege to the First Nations people and culture of this land, we could solve many other issues that plague contemporary society at the same time, including our current environmental predicament. I want to use this forum over the next few weeks to draw continued attention to Reconciliation and what each one of us can do to take ongoing action.


#### **Experiencing Dadirri**

Clear a little space as often as you can, to simply sit and look at and listen to the earth and environment that surrounds you.

Focus on something specific, such as a bird, a blade of grass, a clump of soil, cracked earth, a flower, bush or leaf, a cloud in the sky or a body of water (sea, river, lake...) whatever you can see. Or just **let something find you** be it a leaf, the sound of a bird, the feel of the breeze, the light on a tree trunk. No need to try. Just **wait a while** and let something find you, let it spend time with you. Lie on the earth, the grass, some place. Get to know that little place and let it get to know your warmth, feel your pulse, hear your heart beat, know your breathing, your spirit. Just relax and be there, enjoying the time together. Simply be aware of your focus, allowing yourself to be still and silent..., to listen...

Following this quiet time there may be, on occasion, value in giving expression in some way to the experience of this quiet, still listening. You may wish to talk about the experience or journal, write poetry, draw, paint or sing... This needs to be held in balance - the key to Dadirri is in simply being, rather than in outcomes and activity.

In greeting each morning, remind yourself of dadirri by blessing yourself with the following... "Let tiny drops of stillness fall gently through my day" Noel Davis

Brick facing is tiles for bricks, they are place on front of bricks and will keep their place at school forever. #### Frequent asked questions:

Where will it be located at school: On the lift shaft with the school logo above it.

I have a child starting in 2022 may I purchase a tile for them: Yes anyone can purchase a brick for the future sibling coming into the school just write what year they will be finishing.

How many bricks can I purchase: As many as you require for your family

How can past families purchase tiles: They register with Flexischools and for the class choose "Guest". If anyone requires more instructions I can forward to them.

We purchase a brick many years ago where is that located: Yes they are located near the learning centre behind the white gates. Having these bricks on the lift shaft you will be able to see them while walking down from either the infants or canteen direction. They are in full view for everyone to see.

Brick wording: It is totally up to you what you would like added there is no right or wrong way – family surname and years of service on a separate line or individually listing each child, surname of second line and years of service on bottom line. Main thing to remember is three lines per plaque and 17 letters only per line. Yes - they can do apostrophes. These count as a character. Spaces are also a character in that they take the space of a letter.


























# SCHOOL FEES PAYMENT FREQUENCY FORM
