Dear Parents

STEM PROJECT-STAGE 2

Year 3 and Year 4 students are excited that their STEM project from Semester 1 has been created into a sport's trolley that is their own design.

This STEM project involved many steps of learning. Initially, Year 6 students spoke to all of Stage 2 about the problems and disadvantages of the trolley that was currently in use. This helped students to plan a design that was workable. All Stage 2 classes had an Inquiry Day in the library where they worked in groups of three. Each group used their design thinking to plan a model that would be suitable for a sport's trolley. They drew a model and then created a replica of their design using lego, recycled material and strawbees.

After the Inquiry Day, students discussed their creations and thought about what would work and want wouldn't be appropriate for the trolley. Each class collated a list of the best features for a trolley. A representative from each class was selected to attend a meeting with Daniel Rufo to discuss the optimal design features. Two important themes emerged regarding the construction of the trolley. Students wanted it to be durable and there to be a focus on sustainability by using recycled materials. Daniel was able to take the suggestions and build the trolley.

Stage 2 would like to thank Daniel Rufo for all his hard work and effort with building the trolley and saving materials from going to landfill. Our trolley is a successful STEM project that we are very proud of.

Let's Bee Plant Friendly

In March this year St Therese's applied and was successful in obtaining a Junior Landcare grant to build a flowering native garden and install a native bee hive so that our students could learn about local native plant species and native stingless bees and pollination.

The children in Kindergarten were exploring our local environment and it's characteristics in an integrated Science and Geography unit in Semester 1. Through designing and building a native habitat for local stingless bees we took the information that we had learnt and integrated our skills in developing solutions to an identified need of supporting a native threatened species. Educating our students and increasing our own understanding of the native honey bee (Tetragonula carbonaria) and their numbers is of utmost importance for ecological reasons. By planting native trees we help preserve native species of plants and ecologies, increase the pollination of our own and local flowering plants, improve the productivity of our school vegetable patch and attract native birds and wildlife to our school environment.

The garden on Royal street is nearing completion and we are very grateful to our parent and school community who have helped to make this project possible. A special mention to Christie Malyon who has been involved in all stages of the project and whose knowledge of the local environment is a huge asset to our school. Thankyou to Luke Brownlee for kindly clearing the area prior to planting. To Brad, Christie and Malyon boys for assisting with the garden plan, plant choices and purchasing. To Carla Ladmore for her knowledge, enthusiasm and assistance with planting. To the year 6 students who kindly helped to shovel soil in preparation for planting. And to Odette and the Tonkin family who are working on a beautiful sculpture to be included in the space. An extra big thankyou to Daniel Rufo for his hard work in this area especially constructing a shelter for the beehive. It has been such an enjoyable project to be a part of and we look forward to our students enjoying the space and our bees for many years to come.

ENERGISER OF THE TERM

Hit the Decks!

Stage: Stage 1 - Stage 3 Formation: Standing at desks Equipment: 1 deck of cards

Getting energised:

- 1. The teacher places the deck of cards in front of the class.
- 2. Each suit will correspond to a different activity.
 - Heart: Touch elbow to knee for 10-15 seconds.
 - ◆ Diamond: Jog or march in place for 10–15 seconds.
 - Club: Modified push ups (on knees) for 10–15 seconds.
 - Spade: Star jumps or scissors for 10–15 seconds.
- 3. It may be helpful to write the corresponding activity for each suit on the board.
- 4. The teacher (or a student) picks a card from the deck and the class performs the associated movement.
- The class will perform the corresponding activity for each suit for a set period of time.

Variations:

- 1. Write suits and corresponding activities on butcher's paper so that activities can be done outside.
- 2. Choose 3 or 4 cards of each suit instead of using entire deck to save time.
- 3. Ask students to make up activities themselves
