Seven students across Stage 3 have participated in the Virtual Academy for 2021.

This specialised program for Stage 3 gifted students is focussed on students exploring a real-world problem of their choice and providing solutions based on data collection and comprehensive research. The students have worked successfully on the following projects:

Niah S Waste and rubbish in New Lambton village and how this problem can be solved through initiatives in the community.

<u>Madailein C</u>- Disability access in New Lambton and how as a suburb we can provide a more inclusive space for those with a disability.

<u>Will S</u>- Creating an electric 'Fun Bus' that transports students to school that promotes sustainability. The bus is fun and social with special features on board to encourage a positive atmosphere for children.

Oisin M- Creating a solar car as a vehicle which utilises renewable energy and includes engineering features that include a backup power source.

<u>Philippa A</u>-Designing a school that features environmentally, sustainable improvements focussing on meeting the challenges of a modern world.

<u>Elizabeth W-</u> Addressing the increasing problem of homelessness and creating houses that can be built on a low budget to provide housing for those in need. Devising a fundraiser to raise money for charities that deal with homelessness.

<u>Peter v-</u> Robotics and farming and how this can be used to maximise productivity, whilst maintaining the joy of farming for those in this industry.

The students worked with the teachers from the Virtual Academy as well as their class teachers, Mr Moore, Mrs Petersen and the Gifted Education Mentor, Mrs McNeil. They presented their research to an expert panel last Thursday and were outstanding in the way they conducted themselves. All the students should be extremely proud of their persistence and effort this year to accomplish their projects in the Virtual Academy Program.
