Acting Principal's Message

Dear Parent/Carer.

As we near the end of Term 1, we have seen an increase in the number of COVID positive cases in students and staff. I thank all of you for your vigilance in completing a RAHT if your child displays any COVID symptoms. We continue to focus on safety measures, we hope we can keep our case numbers down. I am pleased to say that in many cases, the symptoms have been relatively mild. I would like to thank the staff for their flexibility, as we try to cover classes when teachers are unwell. Staff have gone above and beyond to assist colleagues and ensure teaching and learning is consistent and of a continued high standard.

Easter Fundraiser

As we get closer to the Easter Season, we would like our community to consider families that may be separated from loved ones, due to illness or those that may face uncertainty. Rather than holding an Easter Raffle, we will focus on community outreach to Ronald McDonald House and the Women's Refuge, as we did last year.

Ronald McDonald House provides a "home away from home" for families whilst their children are treated at John Hunter Hospital. Additionally, Ronald McDonald House provides support for families who do not meet the criteria to reside at the house, but still need to travel significant distances each day to be with their child in hospital. The House is currently fully occupied, with 18 families currently in residence, some have been there for over 8-weeks. The Women's Refuge provide emergency shelter for women and children that may need to leave their homes, due to unsafe environments. So, we would like to present hampers to Ronald McDonald House and the Women's Refuge, to bring some joy and hope, at a time that can be especially difficult.

We ask that the following items are donated, according to the year your child is in, by <u>Wednesday 6 April</u>. We will then prepare the hampers and deliver them in time for Easter, to the families and staff of Ronald McDonald House and the Women's Refuge.

- Kindergarten & Year 1 packs of medium sized hollow eggs
- Years 2 & 3 small hollow Easter bunnies
- Year 4 packs of small solid Easter eggs
- Year 5 tea or coffee e.g. 10 packs of Twinings Tea, Herbal Teas, coffee sachets etc.

Office of Safeguarding - All children are currently undertaking a unit on protective behaviours in their class. This is done in the last three weeks of each school term. As part of this unit, children will read "My Underpants Rule" which is designed to give children strategies to keep themselves safe. Children are also taught to use the correct terminology for their body parts. Research indicates that when children are empowered to speak up, they are less likely to experience abuse. 

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Joint Accounts on Compass to Manage Permissions and Access

24 March 2022

The Catholic Schools Office recently transferred its finance systems to align with the Compass Student Information System used across our schools

To ensure we have accurate information and accessibility for parents and carers to provide permissions for their child's schools activities, such as off-site school events and school excursions, it's important for families to have the correct access and where relevant, joint access.

For security reasons, Compass is established similar to other institutions where only one person has certain permissions. This form is for families that have a single debtor currently established with only one access to the portal for financial matters and we want to make this easier for you. We ask that you complete and return the information below and provide your consent for us to transition you to one jointly accessible account.

A jointly accessible account means that either of the named parties can provide their consent/ permission for school-related activities, view transactions or make payments. Updating your account to joint accessibility will not change your statement transactions.

If you choose not to provide your consent, your school can continue "as is" with only the one nominated parent or carer responsible for providing all consents and payments in the portal.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding this change, please contact your school.

We provide our permission to change the debtor title to be shown as a joint account i.e. with both names.

We understand the current transactions on this school fee account will not change, it is the title that is being altered to show both names.

We consent to transfer any outstanding fees to consolidate to a joint account.

We understand there is no change to the fee proportion of 100% per child.

We understand this change will allow all nominated persons the same access to the Compass portal.

We understand that with a joint account, we are jointly responsible and severally liable for the payment of all fees and expenses incurred while our child is enrolled within the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle irrespective or Court Orders or personal agreements made between parents and carers.

We acknowledge that we will advise the school of any change in our circumstances and ensure contact details are up to date as soon as practicable.
