#### VOLUNTEERING

The Catholic Schools Office (CSO) has created an online application for the volunteering process. Applying through the volunteer site, results in your application going straight to the CSO, then the school gets updates once these are cleared. If you already have your WWCC and completed a paper volunteer application, there is **NO** need for you to reapply. If you would like to volunteer, and have not yet completed an application, please follow the link to do this online https://www.mn.catholic.org.au/people/volunteer/.

When you apply online, you will notified whether you require a WWCC and/or police check. Please note: it can take up to 6 weeks for your application to be approved. You now only need to apply once, further applications are only required if your circumstances changes e.g. change in name etc WWCC expires.

#### Information About Cognitive Assessments

#### What is a cognitive assessment?

A cognitive assessment, sometimes known as an IQ test, can be used to determine your child's overall intellectual ability compared with their same-aged peers. Cognitive and learning assessments can offer you a range of information about your child, and can be used for a variety of purposes. Some examples include:

- Assessment of general intellectual functioning
- · Identification of any learning difficulties, and assess for cognitive delay
- Assessment for potential intellectual giftedness
- Identification of areas of strengths and weakness, and particular learning styles

These assessments can be used to support an application to the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), or for additional funding in the school environment.

#### Who will be administering your child's assessment?



Your child's assessment will be completed by Amanda Kropp, Clinical Psychologist. Amanda is also a Board Approved Supervisor with the Psychology Board of Australia, and is a member of the Australian Psychology Society. She has experience in working with children in both assessment and therapy settings, and has a particular interest in cognitive assessment and childhood development. Amanda will help your child to

feel at ease and reduce any anxiety they might be feeling on the day of their assessment.

#### What cognitive tests do we use?

At Hunter Children's Clinics, we use only the most recent editions of the industry standard assessments of intellectual ability; the Wechsler Intelligence Scales. Grounded in many decades of scientific research, the Wechsler Intelligence Scales are used worldwide and are considered to be the most recognised, comprehensive, and reliable assessment of intelligence across the lifespan.

The Wechsler Intelligence Scales measure intelligence across several domains, providing a comprehensive picture of your child's intellectual ability. Depending on the age of your child, it may also be useful to HUNTER CHILDREN

administer a test of achievement (or academic performance). When combined, intelligence and achievement testing provide a wealth of information that can be used to assist your child to perform to the best of their ability.

What assessments are available?

#### Cognitive Assessments:

#### Wechsler Preschool and Primary Scale of Intelligence | Fourth Edition (WPPSI-IV)

The WPPSI-IV is designed to measure the intelligence of children, generally between the ages of 2 years 6 months, up to the age of 6. Providing a comprehensive picture of your children's general intellectual ability (also referred to as Full Scale Intelligence Quotient), this assessment measures intelligence across four domains:

- 1. Verbal IQ
- 2. Performance IQ
- 3. Processing Speed
- 4. Global Language

#### Wechsler Intelligence Scale for Children | Fifth Edition (WISC-V)

The WISC-V is designed to measure the intelligence of children generally between the ages of 6 years and 16 years. Like the WPPSI-IV, the WISC-V assesses intelligence across five domains that impact performance:

- 1. Verbal Comprehension
- 2. Visual-Spatial
- 3. Fluid Reasoning
- 4. Working Memory
- 5. Processing Speed

#### Wechsler Adult Intelligence Scale | Fourth Edition (WAIS-IV)

The WAIS-IV measures the intelligence of older adolescents and adults between the ages of 16 and 90 years. As Hunter Children's Clinic has a paediatric focus, this assessment will generally be used for individuals between the ages of 16 and 25. The WAIS-IV assesses intelligence across four domains:

- 1. Verbal Comprehension
- 2. Perceptual Reasoning
- 3. Working Memory
- 4. Processing Speed

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#### Academic Performance Assessment:

#### Wechsler Individual Achievement Test | Fourth Edition (WIAT-4)

The WIAT-4 measures the academic performance of children between the ages of 4 and 19 years. While the areas of assessment are tailored to the age of the individual, they generally align with common school subjects, including:

- 1. Reading
- 2. Mathematics
- 3. Written Language
- 4. Oral Language

#### What is included in the assessment?

- An assessment session with your child, using the age-appropriate industry standard Wechsler Intelligence Scales. Please note that if you require both a *cognitive* assessment and an academic performance assessment, testing must be completed across two separate sessions.
- A comprehensive report, with results and recommendations provided in a timely fashion (5-10 business days following the assessment session)
- A one-hour feedback session explaining the results of the assessment and any recommendations, and discussing any questions that may arise

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Joint accounts on Compass to manage permissions and payments

#### 22 March 2022

The Catholic Schools Office recently transferred its finance systems to align with the Compass Student Information System used across our schools.

To ensure we have accurate information and accessibility for parents and carers to provide permissions for their child's schools activities, such as off-site school events and school excursions, it's important for families to have the correct access and where relevant, joint access.

For security reasons, Compass is established similar to other institutions where only one person has certain permissions. This form is for families that have a single debtor currently established with only one access to the portal for financial matters and we want to make this easier for you. We ask that you complete and return the information below and provide your consent for us to transition you to one jointly accessible account.

A jointly accessible account means that either of the named parties can provide their consent/ permission for school-related activities, view transactions or make payments. Updating your account to joint accessibility will not change your statement transactions.

If you choose not to provide your consent, your school can continue "as is" with only the one nominated parent or carer responsible for providing all consents and payments in the portal.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding this change, please contact your school.

We provide our permission to change the debtor title to be shown as a joint account i.e. with both names.

We understand the current transactions on this school fee account will not change, it is the title that is being altered to show both names.

We consent to transfer any outstanding fees to consolidate to a joint account.

We understand there is no change to the fee proportion of 100% per child.

We understand this change will allow all nominated persons the same access to the Compass portal.

We understand that with a joint account, we are jointly responsible and severally liable for the payment of all fees and expenses incurred while our child is enrolled within the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle irrespective or Court Orders or personal agreements made between parents and carers.

We acknowledge that we will advise the school of any change in our circumstances and ensure contact details are up to date as soon as practicable.

# if your child is for more than 10 school days

Parents and carers are encouraged not to withdraw their children from school for family holidays. If your child needs to be away from school for a period greater than two weeks (ten school days) you will need to contact the school and apply for either an Application for Extended Leave Form - Travel or an Exemption from Attendance Form (if for the purpose of Elite Sport or Elite Entertainment Industry). This form needs to be completed, initially by the parent / carer and then by the Principal of the school.

It is important that the exemption form is completed **before** the period that the child is to be away from school. Exemptions **cannot** be issued retrospectively. The school attendance roll will then be updated to ensure that your child's absence is legitimate and explained.

A certificate of Extended Leave - Travel or a Certificate of Exemption will then be issued. If the Principal feels that the extended absence is not in the student's best interests they may decline the application for exemption. Depending on the circumstances and how long the leave will be, you may ask the school to provide tasks that can be completed while your child is absent.

For periods **under** ten days, you will contact the school as per the normal school procedure: note, sms, email or phone.

# Kids look to you to keep them safe

No parking areas and/or kiss and ride zones have been installed at most schools to help parents and carers safely drop off and pick up children.

For these zones to work effectively, parents and carers need to:

- **Be timely.** If there is no indicated time on the No Parking sign, you are only permitted to stop for 2 minutes. If your child does not enter or exit the vehicle within that time, you are required to exit the zone and re-enter when the child is ready
- Not move more than three metres from your vehicle. For example, a driver may get out of the car, open the boot and help children with their bags, but they must not move any further than 3 metres from their vehicle
- Stop their vehicle as close as possible to the head of the zone, this will allow other parents and carers easy access to the zone.



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
