#### VOLUNTEERING

If you already have your WWCC and completed a paper volunteer application, there is **NO** need for you to reapply. If you would like to volunteer, and have not yet completed an application, please follow the link to do this online <a href="https://www.mn.catholic.org.au/people/volunteer/">https://www.mn.catholic.org.au/people/volunteer/</a>.

When you apply online, you will be notified whether you require a WWCC and/or police check. Please note: it can take up to 6 weeks for your application to be approved. You now only need to apply once, further applications are only required if your circumstances changes e.g. change in name etc WWCC expires. Please advise the school via email when you register online, and we will contact you when the clearance is received.

#### Gifted Education News-St Therese's New Lambton

#### **Virtual Academy**

The Virtual Academy Program is unique to Catholic Schools across our diocese and is a specialised program targeted for selected Gifted learners. Students participate in weekly video conferences with specialist teachers and work through units of work and their own research to enhance their critical thinking and real-world problem-solving skills.

We are extremely proud of the seven students at our school in Stage 3 who participate in this program.

Here is an overview of what the students are working on: **Eden** wants to change the chemical composition of plastic so that it can decompose. She is planning to do experiments that feature organisms that consume the plastic. Eden will be seeking the support of expert scientists to guide her through this hypothesis.

**Anna** wants to educate all about inclusive learning environments at schools by catering for those with disabilities. She is developing a website for educators that has useful resources such as a Picture Book to use in the classroom.





**Niah** has created a website for educators in primary school on teaching respect. This includes multi modal texts and excellent resources to assist educators with teaching this very important social skill.

**Wil** presented work on his research around gender equity in sport and politics. He looked closely at data and case studies to see the current figures and representatives of each gender in these specific areas. Wil is an advocate for equal rights for all.

**Oisin** created a Year 10 subject that would teach students important life skills, such as budgeting and understanding financial transactions such as credit cards and Afterpay. Students would also learn about how to cook nutritious meals that are not only healthy but budget friendly with minimal waste.

**Sage** is passionate about the benefits of permaculture gardening. She is planning an organic vegetable garden complete with chickens for a Public Housing Community. Sage feels that all people in our community should have access to these gardens, particularly children.

**Rose** wants all children to be inclusive and celebrate our cultural diversity. She is devising a K-6 Term program that focuses on students learning about a different culture each week. Students would learn about the languages, foods, dances and art styles from other cultures. Parents would be invited to share their cultural stories as well.

I'm sure you will agree their ideas and research is so impressive! The world is in good hands with future leaders and thinkers like these students.....

Last Tuesday, Year 2 students had a visit from Stage 3 Extension Writers who worked with the students on constructing a persuasive text.


Students worked in groups and had a 'mystery bag' with visual prompts and a bush tucker plant sample to stimulate discussion on the topic:




