Sport Uniform

Sport uniform is required on the following days:

- Year 2 Tuesday (Weeks 1-4) then Thursday (Weeks 5-10)
- Year 3N Wednesday
- Year 3W Tuesday
- Year 3L Thursday
- Year 4 Tuesday (Weeks 1-6) then Thursday (Weeks 7-10)
- Year 5 Wednesday (Weeks 1-6) then Thursday (Weeks 7-10)
- Year 6 Thursday (Weeks 1-6) then Tuesday (Weeks 7-10)

Children are to wear their full formal uniform for all other days. Please ensure your child/ren wear their correct uniform – on sport days joggers/runners are appropriate, all other days black leather shoes are to be worn. Please note black skate shoes or black fabric runners are not appropriate. This is to ensure your child's feet are adequately supported and protected.

Sun Protection

As the weather warms up, we encourage you to apply sunscreen to your child/ren. Children are also permitted to bring sunscreen to school to re-apply during the school day – roll on sunscreen is usually the easier for children to manage. Children not wearing hats will be asked to stay off the playground at lunch and recess. If your child misplaces their school hat, please inform their teacher, and ensure they are wearing an alternate hat. Alternative hats are to be worn for a limited time, until their school hat has been found or another school hat has been purchased.

VOLUNTEERING

The Catholic Schools Office (CSO) has created an online application for the volunteering process. On the volunteer site, you can find the Volunteer Handbook, and coming some are videos that go through the Volunteers Induction. Applying through the volunteer site, results in your application going straight to the CSO, then the school gets updates once these are cleared. If you already have your WWCC and completed a paper volunteer application, there is **NO** need for you to reapply. If you would like to volunteer, and have not yet completed an application, please follow the link to do this online https://www.mn.catholic.org.au/people/volunteer/.

When you apply online, you will be notified whether you require a WWCC and/or police check. Please note: it can take up to 6 weeks for your application to be approved. You now only need to apply once, further applications are only required if your circumstances changes e.g. change in name etc WWCC expires. Please advise the school via email when you register online, and we will contact you when the clearance is received.
