#### **Omegle Social Media App**

Like all social media parents need to be mindful that Omegle has the very strong potential of placing your child in harms' way. Having spoken to some of the classes it is obvious that some of our children are aware of Omegle and are using it. I have decided then to make you, the parents, aware of the potential harm of a platform like Omegle.

Here are some educational links about Omegle Later in this bulletin you can read in more detail what Omegle is all about. Basically, Omegle is a free online chat website (optimised for mobile) that pairs two random users together in a text and/or video chat. You can add topics you wish to discuss to find users with common interests. There is an 'unmoderated section' for video chat, which may include prominent links to sexualised content on third-party websites.

Omegle does not verify the age of users so anyone can use this.

#### Office of Safeguarding (OoSG)

Just a reminder that all visitors and volunteers to the school need to be signed into the Compass kiosk, at the front office. Clerical staff will then give you a lanyard which must be worn, at all times, when on the school site. Please remember to sign out when leaving the school site.

If your child comes to school late or needs to be signed out early, please come into the school office to sign in/out of the Compass kiosk. Children are not to be left at the school gate in they arrive more than a few minutes late, as the roll would already have been finalised by the classroom teacher.

#### **VOLUNTEERING**

The Catholic Schools Office (CSO) has created an online application for the volunteering process. On the volunteer site, you can find the Volunteer Handbook, and coming some are videos that go through the Volunteers Induction. Applying through the volunteer site, results in your application going straight to the CSO, then the school gets updates once these are cleared. If you already have your WWCC and completed a paper volunteer application, there is **NO** need for you to reapply. If you would like to volunteer, and have not yet completed an application, please follow the link to do this online <a href="https://www.mn.catholic.org.au/people/volunteer/">https://www.mn.catholic.org.au/people/volunteer/</a>.

When you apply online, you will be notified whether you require a WWCC and/or police check. Please note: it can take up to 6 weeks for your application to be approved. You now only need to apply once, further applications are only required if your circumstances changes e.g. change in name etc WWCC expires. Please advise the school via email when you register online, and we will contact you when the clearance is received.

#### Unofficial social media and content protocols

In addition to Catholic Schools Office (CSO) official social media platforms, there are often informal and unofficial social media pages or groups related to our schools where engagement can take place.

These groups are typically established and administered by those with a connection to, but outside our organisation. Examples of this include but are not limited to parent groups, past student groups and school community pages.

The Diocese is committed to respectful, <u>constructive</u> and inclusive behaviour on social media. The below applies to all posts and content related to the Diocese and its agencies and school communities, including alumni, <u>community</u> and parent groups. The following are subject to ongoing alteration due to the ever-changing nature of technology and online communications:

- Use of Agency or school names is to be avoided, these are only permitted for use/inclusion in formal and approved Diocesan channels.
- Agency logos, school crests or identifiable uniforms are not to be used.
- All pages/groups are encouraged to be open, not closed, to promote inclusivity, not exclusivity.
- No images/ video of children, clients and/or students in school uniforms are to be shared
- No defamation of agencies, schools or person(s) affiliated with the organisation.
- No comments which infringe on copyrights.
- No confidential information of clients, students or staff is to be shared.
- No name-calling, personal attacks, hate speech, nudity, profanity/obscenity/ vulgarity.

The CSO reserves the right to request that content or pages/groups be removed if they exhibit any of these qualities in connection with the CSO and/or its schools.

The Catholic Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle has the right to request content, pages or groups be removed if they exhibit any of the above. The terms and conditions of the social media platform should also be followed.





### **OMEGLE**



Omegle is a website that allows you to randomly chat to a stranger.

When a user opens Omegle they have two options - 'Text chat' or
'Video Chat'. The user does not have to verify or identify themself when they use
Omegle. You simply pick the text or video option then get paired with a 'Stranger'.

There is an option to connect Omegle to your Facebook account, which allows the user to find 'chat partners' with similar interests.

If the user chooses to use this feature it opens up potential for the users friends to see the Omegle activity on their profile. There is an option to change the setting to 'Me Only' so the Omegle activity is not shared.

#### Challenges

The Omegle privacy policy clearly states that the following information is saved on their servers for 120 days: 'the time your chat began, your IP address, a randomly-generated ID tag assigned to your computer, your chat partner's IP address, and your chat partner's randomly-generated ID tag'. While this data is used for law enforcement and to try to track and prevent spammers, note that you are willingly providing this information when using Omegle.

At the end of a chat the user has the option to save the chat log and is able to share the link. Therefore the users conversation is not actually private, and the contents of the chat including any personal information you might share can be sent to anyone without their knowledge.

There are two video chats within Omegle. Monitored and Unmonitored. Using the video chat mode requires that the users IP address is made available to the 'Stanger's' computer. Omegle video chat requires a direct connection to be made between users computer and the 'Stranger's' computer. The below picture is a warning received when the user is initiating an unmonitored video chat with a 'Stranger'.
