Assistant Principals Message

Office of Safeguarding (OoSG)

Parents have access to an online booklet on *Cyberbullying a guide for people under 18*. This booklet explains what cyberbullying is, how to report it, and how to get help if you are bullied online. Link There are also several upcoming webinars for Families from the eSafety Commission, join one of the free webinars for parents and carers. These live webinars give parents and carers the knowledge, skills, and tools to support their children to have safe online experiences. The eSafety Commission 2022 webinars include a broad range of topics that will be delivered by their expert education and training team, please access the link to see what is currently available.

Assessment of Students

This week, we are undertaking standardised testing of all students, in line with the Catholic School Office Diocesan-Wide Assessment Schedule. Kindergarten students, and any student that has enrolled in St Therese's this year on other grades, will complete the Cognitive Achievement Test (CogAT), which assesses children in three categories: quantitative reasoning, qualitative reasoning, and spatial awareness. CogAT is designed to identify students who are gifted or high achieving across some or all these three categories. Progressive Achievement Testing (PAT) is completed by all students in Years 1-6, in Maths, Reading and Grammar & Punctuation (Years 3-6 only for this test). PAT is a diagnostic test, which assists teachers to forward plan teaching and learning activities that target areas students need to focus on. There is no "study" for CogAT and PAT, instead we encourage students to do their best.

Vandalism at School

Over the past two weeks, it is disappointing to see an increase in graffiti on the walls of the toilets and on the play equipment, damage to school property (such as the lost property baskets being pulled off the wall) and damage to the plants. Despite a large amount of time being spent looking into these acts, we have not been able to identify the students directly involved. Please discuss this with your child/ren and encourage them to notify teachers if they see any of these negative behaviours. We have a beautiful school, and we are all responsible for ensuring our school environment is welcoming and well cared for.

<u>Gospel Reflection</u> – This week's reflection below, by Dianna Bergant, speaks of the radical and liberating nature of our lives should we be able to live fully transformed by the power of the Resurrection:

Both the reading from Maccabees and the passage from the gospel speak of resurrection. The first is a testimony of faith, the second demonstrates a measure of scorn that accompanies unbelief. Belief in resurrection is not the same as the conviction of the immortality of the soul. The latter is based on the makeup of the human person; the former rests on the fidelity of

God. The doctrine of resurrection is grounded in the concept of covenant, which claims that God has established a relationship with human beings. At issue is whether or not death is powerful enough to break the ties that bind us in covenant with God. Jesus says 'No!' If this is the future that awaits us, how are we to live until it dawns? Actually, it has already dawned. This is the eschatological hope in which we live by the grace given us from God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Our future is already present and, therefore, we are called to live lives that have been radically transformed. However, the future has not yet completely dawned, and so we find ourselves living both in this age and in the age to come. Thus we live future lives, but we live them in the present. As difficult as this may be, we have the promise that the Lord will strengthen us and guard us. We have the instruction of our religious tradition that directs our minds and hearts. When we live lives of the future, we truly enable that future to dawn in the present.

VOLUNTEERING

The Catholic Schools Office (CSO) has created an online application for the volunteering process. On the volunteer site, you can find the Volunteer Handbook, and coming some are videos that go through the Volunteers Induction. Applying through the volunteer site, results in your application going straight to the CSO, then the school gets updates once these are cleared. If you already have your WWCC and completed a paper volunteer application, there is **NO** need for you to reapply. If you would like to volunteer, and have not yet completed an application, please follow the link to do this online https://www.mn.catholic.org.au/people/volunteer/.

When you apply online, you will be notified whether you require a WWCC and/or police check. Please note it can take up to 6 weeks for your application to be approved. You now only need to apply once, further applications are only required if your circumstances changes e.g. change in name etc WWCC expires. Please advise the school via email when you register online, and we will contact you when the clearance is received.

Payment options

We wish to advise that the preferred method of payment of fees, excursions or other items is either via credit card, BPAY or direct debit. Although Compass Pay is on option on the Compass platform, we request that this NOT be used due to technical difficulties with the system.

Please note that if at any time you need assistance with your fees or unsure about any of these payment methods, please contact our office.




