Opening School Mass

The start of the new school year is always so exciting, as we can develop goals for the year ahead, make new friends and experience new opportunities. The Diocesan theme for 2023 is "Encounter – Journey Together", so here at St Therese's we are focused our faith, academic and social/emotional journey together.

Kindergarten Information Evening

We will hold an information evening for our Kindergarten parents/carers on **Wednesday 22 Wednesday** at 6:00pm in the Catherine McAuley Centre. This will be a wonderful opportunity to meet the kindergarten teaching team and school leadership team. We will go through the routines of kindergarten, school life at St Therese's and navigate through Compass. We look forward to seeing you there.

Office of Safeguarding

This term in library lessons, Mrs Barker is focussing on cybersafety across all grades K-6. A few tips to keep your children safe when they are online:

- Ensure your child(ren) are in a public area of your home when online e.g. the lounge room, kitchen etc. Do not allow your child to use devices alone in their bedrooms.
- Ensure your child is using age appropriate sites

Devices are an invaluable tool to keep us connected to others and access current information. Together, we will help all children to be safe and effective users of technology.

Flexible Groups in Mathematics and English

Next week (Week 5) we begin flexible groups in Mathematics and English in Years 1-6. To ensure all children are placed in the group that is most appropriate to ensure they are both supported and challenged, all teachers in Years 1-6 were released for ½ a day last week, to analyse PAT data, classroom assessments and teacher observations. Teachers continue to review student progress throughout the term, in Case Management Meetings (Weeks 3 & 8 each term), and flexible groups are adjusted if needed. NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be held from the 15 March – 27 March this year. All students in Years 3 and 5 complete the NAPLAN in the following areas:

- Reading
- Writing
- Conventions of Language •
- Numeracy

Children complete NAPLAN online, except for the writing test for Year 3, which is completed in a booklet. Children do not need to "study" for NAPLAN, children also do not need to worry about the tests. The results of the tests allow us to identify student achievement, but more importantly we use the data to identify where we as a school are using effective strategies and programs in our teaching of English and Mathematics. Parents in Years 3 & 5 received a parent letter about NAPLAN, which was also uploaded to Compass.

Opening School Mass 2023 - Thank you to those parents, grandparents, carers and friends who were able to attend our opening school mass and leadership presentation for 2023, it was great to see you there. Thank you also to Fr Velerian for celebrating the Eucharist with our community.

Shrove Tuesday & Caritas Launch: Project Compassion - Next Tuesday 21st February is Shrove Tuesday - the day before Ash Wednesday and the commencement of the season of Lent. Shrove Tuesday is often also referred to as Pancake Tuesday and, as such, the school will be offering the opportunity for all students to purchase pancakes through the school canteen, via Flexischools, at a cost of \$1.00 each, with all money raised going to Project Compassion. The cut off for orders will be 3pm on Friday 17th February. Caritas also traditionally launches their Project Compassion initiative on this day each year. The theme of this year's Project Compassion is, 'For All Future Generations'. There will also be Family Project Compassion boxes being sent home next week and you are encouraged to support this worthy cause. We will be asking for all boxes and money to be returned by the end of term.



Ash Wednesday & Lent – Wednesday 22nd February is Ash Wednesday, a holy day of obligation and the beginning of Lent. As such, we will be taking our Primary students (Years 3-6) to the church for Mass at 12:30pm, with all parents most welcome to attend. Some of the ashes from this Mass will be brought back to school where our Infants students will participate in an Ash Wednesday liturgy after recess at 2:30pm in the Hall. There is also a parish Mass at St Therese's church at 7pm later that evening.

School Community News

Volunteering

Throughout the year, we welcome all parents/carers to volunteer at the school. To volunteer, you must complete the volunteer's induction via the link <u>https://www.mn.catholic.edu.au/families-communities/volunteers/</u>. This process can take up to 6 weeks, so you are encouraged to complete this early.

Parent/Teacher Meetings

We will have Parent/Teacher meetings in Weeks 6. These can be booked through Compass. This is an excellent opportunity to meet your child's teacher and set goals for your child for Semester 1. If your child is in a job-share class, you will book the meeting with only **one** teacher, the meeting will then be conducted by the teacher who normally works on the day you have booked in.

School Photos

Our school photos will be held on 23rd & 24th February. Children are to wear their full, formal uniform for their class and individual photos. Children can wear their sport uniform for the family photos, as these are done across two days during lunch time. We try to work around the sport roster to ensure all children are in their formal uniform, it is very difficult to try to organise the photo roster around individual children who may have prior commitments on photo day.

Family Photos

Parents ordering family photos online need to order before 9pm **THE DAY PRIOR TO PHOTO DAY**. This option isn't available online after this time, to ensure we don't miss any orders after we have left the office.

Payment options

We wish to advise that the preferred method of payment of fees, excursions or other items is either via credit card, BPAY or direct debit. Although Compass Pay is on option on the Compass platform, we request that this NOT be used due to technical difficulties with the system.

Please note that if at any time you need assistance with your fees or unsure about any of these payment methods, please contact our office.

External Providers

If your child will be seeing an external provider whilst at school (eg; Guitar lessons, speech pathology) you will need to complete the attached form and return it to the school asap.

School Fees

School fees are calculated on an annual basis, please see attached letter from the Catholic Schools Office outlining 2023 fees and levy information. You will receive your statement at end of February. When you receive your statement, please arrange for a regular Bpay, Direct Debit or an annual payment. Cash payments can be accepted at the administration office between 8.00am-3.30pm Monday to Friday or credit card payments can be taken over the phone on 4957 4922. You will find a direct debit form attached to the newsletter for your convenience. If you have a health care card (HCC), please complete the

Direct Debit Request Service Agreement

Definitions

account means the account held at your financial institution from which we are authorised to arrange for funds to be debited.

agreement means the Direct Debit Request Service Agreement between you and us, including the direct debit request.

business day means a day other than a Saturday or a Sunday or a listed public holiday.

debit day means the day that payment is due.

debit payment means a particular transaction where a debit is made, according to your direct debit request.

direct debit request means the Direct Debit Request between us and you.

us and we and our means the Catholic Development Fund.

you means the customer(s) who signed the direct debit request.

your financial institution is the financial institution where you hold the account that you have authorised us to arrange to debit.

1. Debiting your account

By signing a direct debit request, you have authorised us to arrange for funds to be debited from your account according to the agreement we have with you.

We will only arrange for funds to be debited from your account:

as authorised in the direct debit request;

If the debit day falls on a day that is not a business day, we may direct your financial institution to debit your account on the following or previous business day. If you are unsure about which day your account has or will be debited, please check with your financial institution.

2. Changes by you

If you wish to stop or defer a debit payment you must write to us at least 12 business days before the next debit day. This notice should be given to us in the first instance.

3. Your obligations

It is your responsibility to ensure that there are sufficient clear funds available in your account to allow a debit payment to be made. If there are insufficient dear funds available in your account to meet a debit payment:

 you or your account may be charged a fee and/or interest by your financial institution;

 you or your account may be charged a fee to reimburse us for charges we have incurred for the failed transaction;
 you must arrange for the payment to be made by another method or arrange for sufficient clear funds to be in your account within the next 7 days or another time we agree with you so that we can process the debit payment.

Please check your account statement to verify that the amounts debited from your account are correct.

4. Dispute

If you believe that there has been an error in debiting your account you should call us on 4979 1160 and confirm the details in writing with us as soon as possible so that we can resolve your query quickly.

5. Accounts

You should check:

 with your financial institution whether direct debiting is available from your account as direct debiting is not available on all accounts offered by financial institutions.
 your account details which you have provided to us are correct by checking them against a recent account statement; and

 with your financial institution before completing the direct debit request if you have any queries about how to complete the direct debit request.

Warning: if the account number you have quoted is incorrect, you may be charged a fee to reimburse our costs in correcting any deductions from:

- · an account you do not have authority to operate; or
- an account you do not own.

6. Confidentiality

We will keep any information (including your account details) in your direct debit request confidential. We will make reasonable efforts to keep any such information that we have about you secure and to ensure that any of our employees or agents who have access to information about you do not make any unauthorised use, modification, reproduction, or disclosure of that information.

Re: 2023 Fees, levies and family discount

Each year- we review our fees and levies to ensure we can maintain and operate our schools at a high standard, now and into the future. While a significant portion of the cost of education is provided by State and Commonwealth Governments, the contribution of parents and parishes is still important in achieving that purpose.

We seek to make Catholic diocesan schools as affordable as possible and aim to keep your family's contribution as low as possible whilst achieving the strongest educational and spiritual outcomes for the over 20,000 students across our 58 schools. Importantly, we are committed to ensuring that no child will be denied a Catholic education because of a family's genuine inability to cover the fees.

This year, we have continued to support many families across our Diocese by reducing their fees or arranging other payment plans. We will continue to support families facing genuine hardship.

For families with multiple children attending Diocesan Catholic Schools, we are maintaining the Family Discount at 2022 levels. Furthermore, for families with limited financial resources, discounted tuition fees are provided to Health Care and Pension Card holders who continue to receive a 50% discount off the Diocesan Tuition fee for each member of the family.

In 2023, Diocesan Tuition Fees will increase by 5%, with the Family School Building Levy increasing by 5%. Further detail outlining our 2023 Fees, Levy and Contributions is attached.

This year in the face of rising construction costs, we have continued to upgrade existing schools' facilities and amenities, whilst investing in new school building works across the Diocese.

In establishing these fees and levies, we have sought to ensure the best possible learning environment for your children. We thank you for your continued support of our schools and **assure families that where affordability is a real issue, you will be supported in your need.**

2023 Fees, Levy and Contributions

Tuition Fees

In 2023, Diocesan Tuition Fees will be as follows.

Family Discount

In 2023, the Family Discount will be maintained at the 2022 level and is applied to the full rate of Tuition Fees for families with multiple children attending Diocesan Catholic Schools as follows;

1 child family	No discount
2 child family	15%
3 child family	25%
4+ child family	50%

Affordability and support

The Diocese is committed to ensuring that no child will be denied a Catholic education because of a family's genuine inability to cover the fees.

To assist families with limited financial resources, discounted tuition fees are provided to Health Care and Pension Card holders. Discounted tuition fees are provided to Health Care and Pension Card holders. The discounted tuition fee is 50% of the full rate for each child and the discount is only applied to the Tuition Fee.

Additionally, any family experiencing financial difficulty is entitled to fee assistance and will be appropriately and confidentially supported to assess what is affordable for their family. The school principal can be contacted to discuss these matters.
