Please start sending in your Project Compassion boxes from home over the coming weeks so that we can bank all funds and send through to Caritas as soon as possible.





School Athletics Carnival – The first Friday of Term 2 (28th April), will be our whole-school Athletics Carnival at the Fearnley Dawes Athletics Track, Newcastle West. This year, we will return to a whole-school event with all students, K-6 participating on the day. This promises to be a great way to build community spirit. Most students will be transported both to-and-from the track inside regular school hours. The day, however, will run as two separate events:

- Those students in Kindergarten and Year 1 (*along with a small number of Yr 2 students who do not turn 8 in 2023*) will attend and participate in a fun-day of races, relays and rotational tabloid events. These same students, after the completion of all activities, will return to school on buses around 12:30pm.
- All other students who turn 8, or older, in the 2023 calendar year will participate in the competitive version of events as they will be eligible to continue through to Regional level should they be successful. The events that these students will participate in on the day are: 100m (*age-based*), 200m, shot-put and long-jump (all *category-based* events).

To explain the above, for example, an 8yr old girl will compete in the 100m race against ONLY other 8yr old girls (*there may be several heats, so results will be determined based upon times*). The same 8yr old girl will compete in the Junior Girls (8-10yr girls) for the category-based events of 200m, shot-put and long-jump.

The categories are as follows: Junior Girls & Junior Boys (8-10yrs), 11yr Girls & 11yr Boys, and Senior Girls & Senior Boys (12-13yrs). These are the same categories that are in existence at the higher levels of competition (*Regional, Diocesan, State, etc.*).

Optional Events: Both the 800m & 1500m races are optional events (category-based also), with the **800m races commencing at 9:00am. The children who wish to enter this event will need to arrive at the track by 8:45am** <u>via private transport</u> to meet with myself in preparation for marshalling. The 1500m race will be the final event of the day. There will be a Compass event created and sent out soon regarding nominations for these. When this occurs, please be aware of the final nomination date as no late entries will be able to be submitted.

<u>Parent Helpers</u>: Please email me directly (<u>luke.smith@mn.catholic.edu.au</u>) if you can help on the day – please list your child's name/year group so I know which of the two events to place you at during the day.

School Buses – Temporary Changes

From 3 April – for approx. 3 weeks:

Bus stop McCaffrey Drive at Rosedale Crescent (ID: 2287294), Rankin Park

This stop will be temporarily closed for approx. 3 weeks due to City of Newcastle footpath construction work.

Students will need to use the closest bus stop, McCaffrey Drive opposite Duval St (2287293) which is a 3-minute walk up the hill (east) towards Duval St.

From 12 April – for approx. 4 weeks

Bus stop McCaffrey Drive opposite Duval St (ID: 2287293), Rankin Park This stop will be closed temporarily for 4 weeks due to City of Newcastle tree and construction works. Students will need to use the temporary bus stop located approx. 65m up the hill (east).

Signage will be posted on these bus stops to inform customers and students, but we ask that you also communicate these changes where possible to minimise any disruptions to student travel.

Wonder Recycling Rewards for Schools:

Hello All, please be aware that we have signed up and are involved in a new recycling program offered by Wonder (white) Bread.

It involves collecting and bringing in all your empty - and clean - bread bags - (any brand). These are collected and traded for points to spend at RHSports for new equipment towards the end of

the year. Recycling begins NOW! And goes through **to 7**th **July**. Please send all empty bread bags to our Main Office where we have the collection bin. <u>https://www.wonder.com.au/articles/what-can-you-recycle</u>



What can you recycle?

You can recycle any type of bread bag as part of the Wonder Recycling Rewards program! To clarify what we classify as a bread bag, read below: The rule of thumb is that if it has contained bread of some sort and is a soft plastic, then it's a bread bag. If it hasn't contained bread, then it's not a bread bag. How do we collect the bread bags at school*? Set up your Wonder Recycling Rewards Collection Box (there are four sent to you in your Wonder Recycling Rewards Kit). We suggest you set up one box at a time in a location that is easy for students to see and access. Can we recycle other materials other than bread bags? As part of the Wonder Recycling Rewards program we are only collecting bread bags. Do our bread bags need to be clean? Bread bags should be as free from crumbs as they can be to keep the recycling process free from contamination (there is no need to wash them). How are the bread bags recycled when we have collected them? Our recycling partner APR Plastics manages the recycling proces www.wonder.com.au

Developing a Growth Mindset

Learning behaviours and thinking are key to students being motivated and positive about their learning. At school, we talk to students about having a Growth Mindset. This is a way of thinking that encourages us to try new learning opportunities. When you have a Growth Mindset, challenges are seen as learning opportunities and mistakes are embraced as part of the learning journey.

Learners with a Growth Mindset can:

- Learn from their mistakes
- Use feedback constructively
- Be challenged
- Persevere with learning
- Use effort and a positive attitude for all learning tasks




This way of thinking and self-talk has proven results. It is not only a way of thinking for students but for learners of all ages! Those students who may be perfectionists about their learning, benefit from adopting a growth mindset as mistakes and errors are seen as learning opportunities.

The Virtual Academy Program 2023

This specialised program which is unique in the Catholic School's Office for Stage 3 gifted students is focussed on students exploring a real-world problem and providing solutions based on data collection and comprehensive research. Students present their research in Term 4 across the Virtual Academy community of schools.

Congratulations to our new Virtual Academy students in Year 5; Harry N and Phoebe M who are working studiously in the program and are already so organised and focused on their tasks. Our Year 6 students, Sage T, Rose H, Eden H and Anna V are continuing their work in the Virtual Academy and being excellent mentors to our Year 5 students.



High Quality Programs and Differentiation

The staff at St Therese's are highly skilled in differentiating the curriculum to provide challenging and robust learning activities in subject areas for all students. Students in Stage 1, Stage 2 and Stage 3 participate in Enrichment Writing and Mathematics groups that compact the curriculum and promote critical and creative thinking. Real-world issues are investigated that link with curriculum outcomes. For example, the Year 2 Mathematics group analysed a site from the Australian Museum about collecting data on endangered frogs. This linked with work on number and data and students were excited to be posed so many questions that applied their mathematical thinking and reasoning. It was also fun to investigate endangered frogs and hear the sounds they make!



Maths Extension

Children in Stages 1, 2 and 3 that have been identified as being gifted in Maths, or very high achieving based on assessments and standardised tests, participate in a Maths Extension groups. These students work at a faster pace, learn content that is 6-12 months ahead of their same age peers and explore tasks that allow them to apply their knowledge to real-world challenges. Students look for ways to explore mathematical patterns in our everyday lives. Students were excited to explore Pi on "International Pi Day "the 14th March 2023 (3.14159...)



We are thrilled to offer a **Poetry Club** at our school for **passionate writers** in Kindergarten to Year 6. Susan Sheridan, a parent volunteer is coordinating the Poetry Club which was enjoyed by students last year. Susan is highly skilled and qualified in teaching Poetry and has previously lectured at universities and organised Poetry Clubs in the United Kingdom.

Each fortnight, starting on **Wednesday 10th May at 8:00- 8:45 am in the library,** students will analyse different types of poems such as nonsense and shape poems or rhyming couplets. They will produce their own poems and learn techniques of performance as well.

It will be lots of fun and a fantastic opportunity for those that love poetry, words and writing. There is no cost.


