Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Carers

I'd like to congratulate all the children in years 3 and 5 for the great effort they have put into their NAPLAN test. I want to reaffirm with parents that the NAPLAN test is a diagnostic test designed to see what child can't do, rather that what they can do. In other words the results of the tests are used so that the teacher can better address the learning needs of the children. This year the test was brought forward from the end of May to March so that the results could be given to teachers earlier.

This week also sees the beginning of PP (Personalised Planning) meetings. These meetings are designed for parents to have an opportunity to talk directly to learning support and their child's classroom teacher around how to best address the needs of their children. My thanks to the parents and staff for making themselves available. This is only offered to children that currently access our Learning Support services.

PEG Meeting

Last Friday we held our first PEG (Parent Engagement Group) meeting for the year. My thanks to the 20 parents who made the time to come and speak about how, as a school, we can better address their children's needs. At the meeting I spoke about the schools strategic plan for the next three years and parents spoke about what they feel would be beneficial for their children and the school. The main topics of conversation were: -

- Sport, parents wanting greater participation, not just representative sport.
- Swimming carnival, how can this be inclusive of all the children
- Wellbeing, how can we work together to ensure our children's wellbeing is at the forefront of what we do
- Fundraising ideas
- Ideas around creative arts

This Tuesday evening from 6-7pm the second round of PEG meetings will be held in the Catherine McAuley Centre. All parents are welcome to attend. The agenda will be the same as the Friday meeting last week-strategic plan followed by opportunities for parents to talk about what they see as important topics for our school.

Majority of the NAPLAN tests have now been completed. This week we will finalise any catch ups for children away last week. I thank all the students for their hard work in completing the tests, and all the staff involved in the organisation and supervision of the NAPLAN.

Easter Collection

At St Therese's, we are focused on service and outreach to those less fortunate than ourselves. The is particularly important during Lent, as we reach out to assist others is a form of almsgiving. So, rather than having an Easter Raffle, we ask families to donate items that will be used to create hampers for the staff and residents of St John's Catholic Nursing Home in New Lambton and Ronald McDonald House. Thu lives in Vietnam. When Thu was 12 years old, he stepped on an unexploded land mine and lost his leg.

Living with a disability in rural Vietnam presented many challenges for Thu, who worked mainly as a rice farmer. Thu also took on the role of caring for his wife, Linh, after she suffered a stroke.

Determined to turn their lives around, Thu and Linh joined the Empowerment of People with Disabilities program, run by Caritas Australia's local partner in Vietnam, the Centre for Sustainable Rural Development (SRD).

For Thu, the greatest impact the program has had is enabling the change in Linh's physical and mental wellbeing. With the support of a physiotherapist, Linh can now walk short distances with the aid of a walking stick.

School Athletics Carnival – The first Friday of Term 2 (28th April), will be our whole-school Athletics Carnival at the Fearnley Dawes Athletics Track, Newcastle West. This year, we will return to a whole-school event with all students, K-6 participating on the day. This promises to be a great way to build community spirit. Most students will be transported both to-and-from the track inside regular school hours. The day, however, will run as two separate events:

- Those students in Kindergarten and Year 1 (along with a small number of Yr 2 students who do not turn 8 in 2023) will attend and participate in a fun-day of races, relays and rotational tabloid events. These same students, after the completion of all activities, will return to school on buses around 12:30pm.
- All other students who turn 8, or older, in the 2023 calendar year will participate in the competitive version of events as they will be eligible to continue through to Regional level should they be successful. The events that these students will participate in on the day are: 100m (*age-based*), 200m, shot-put and long-jump (all *category-based* events).

To explain the above, for example, an 8yr old girl will compete in the 100m race against ONLY other 8yr old girls (*there may be several heats, so results will be determined based upon times*). The same 8yr old girl will compete in the Junior Girls (8-10yr girls) for the category-based events of 200m, shot-put and long-jump.

The categories are as follows: Junior Girls & Junior Boys (8-10yrs), 11yr Girls & 11yr Boys, and Senior Girls & Senior Boys (12-13yrs). These are the same categories that are in existence at the higher levels of competition (*Regional, Diocesan, State, etc.*).

Optional Events: Both the 800m & 1500m races are optional events (category-based also), with the 800m races commencing at 9.00am. The children who wish to enter this event will need to arrive



at the track by 8:45am via private transport to meet with myself in preparation for marshalling. The 1500m race will be the final event of the day. There will be a Compass event created and sent out soon regarding nominations for these. When this occurs, please be aware of the final nomination date as no late entries will be able to be submitted.
