Easter Season

Last Sunday we celebrated Palm Sunday where Jesus triumphantly rode into Jerusalem to mark the beginning of the prophecy that would end with his resurrection on Easter Sunday. Easter is the most important event in the Christian calendar. It brings home the message that Jesus died and rose on the third day. This message of resurrection is the salvific mission of Jesus. Jesus was born, lived his life, died and rose from the dead so that each of us could have life and have it to the full (St John).

I invite you to join together with the wider Parish community to celebrate Easter – Holy Thursday 7.00pm St Therese's, washing of the feet, Good Friday Stations of the Cross 10am, Veneration of the Cross 3pm. 

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
