To bring Christ and His message, in all its richness, into the hearts and lives of all.

#### **Objectives of the Project**

- Period poverty is the lack of access to sanitary products, menstrual hygiene education and inadequate toilet facilities.
- It is also the stigma and feelings of shame and embarrassment of a normal bodily function, related teasing and bullying and subsequent impacts on mental health.
- Research indicates this is due to the high costs of feminine hygiene products, inadequate bathroom facilities and lack of inclusive gender education and awareness across student populations.

A Diocesan-wide working group was formed to investigate the impact of period poverty in our schools and examine the feasibility of:

- 1. Installing free period products in dispensing machines in our schools, aligned with the placement of the sanitary bins.
- 2. Developing an awareness education program for all schools in conjunction with the syllabus.
- 3. Developing a policy that will help reinforce the promotion of dignity, gender equality and reproductive health.

#### **Staff Professional Development**

This afternoon/evening the staff will be undertaking work in relation to preparing for the reporting process. There have been a number of amendments especially to the K- 2 reports. These new reports will better reflect the new English and Maths curriculum. Changes to the Years 3 – 6 reports will occur once the new years 3 -6 English and Maths curriculums have been implemented. The half yearly reports are due to be released in Week 10 and half yearly interviews will occur for most classes early in Term 3.

# Winter Uniform

The official change over to the winter uniform is **Thursday 1 June**. As the temperature gets colder, please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the weather and that all clothing is labelled. Please ensure the regardless of whether your child is in their winter or summer uniform, they are wearing the correct St Therese's uniform:

- No branded clothing or hoodies
- Hair accessories need to be blue or white
- Beanies may be worn, but must be blue, otherwise students are to wear their school hat
- Jewellery is to be kept at a minimum stud earrings and single chain with a cross are permitted
- Black leather laced OR velcro shoes are to be worn on all days other than sport days
- Black skate shoes, black joggers and leather boots are not permitted
  Make up, nail polish and hair dye is not permitted

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If your child is unable to wear their correct uniform for a day or two, please send an email or note to their teacher.

## **Religious Education**

Easter Season: The Ascension of the Lord – (Sunday 21st May, 2023) As we move towards Pentecost and then a return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, the following reflection on Sunday's Gospel by Fr Michael Tate reminds us what it is to truly know and live as, 'Easter People'. People who are the loving, joy filled and peaceful incarnation of the Risen Christ – Christ alive in us!

#### Where is the Body?

Our Risen Lord Jesus Christ could have continued to appear to groups of followers, century after century – until now!

But, he didn't, because the disciples had to be weaned of his Risen-mode of appearance among them lest they think that the victory over Death is meant for human beings alone.

But, as St Paul says, the Risen Lord is the One who 'fills all creation' with His power radiating out from his Risen Humanity.

However, dis-appearance is not the same as absence. We believe that Our Risen Lord is present in many modes, including as St Paul says ' ... the Church which is His Body'.

That is why the figures in white rebuke the disciples: 'Why do you stand looking into Heaven?'

The Disciples had, rather, to ready themselves to be the Spirit-filled body of Jesus Christ in their own time

and place. As we do.

We might pause for a moment to stop staring into Heaven, to ready ourselves to receive the Holy Spirit as at Pentecost in order to be, 'The Church which is His Body.'






Hi all,


