



### **Gifted Education News Term Three- St Therese's New Lambton**

We have opportunities in our school for selected students to participate in Enrichment Groups for Writing and Mathematics in Stage 1, 2 and 3.

Our Stage 2 Extension Writers have done a fantastic job this term writing a persuasive text on the following topic related to their Health unit:

The discussions related to this topic were outstanding and really showcased the children's critical thinking skills. We always mind map our ideas before writing so that we have a plan before composing our texts.

Our Year 6 Extension Writers have been doing a case study on Taylor Swift for their Discussion text this term. Students investigated sophisticated marketing and social media strategies that artists use as well as performance skills and musical collaborations which enhance their popularity amongst fans. It has been an excellent way to analyse the power and influence of social media for our Year 6 writers. The Year 6 writers will be visiting Year 2 students this week to model the writing process. Hope B and Jordan T will lead the class groups and students will have mystery bags related to historical artefacts to stimulate discussions. A huge thankyou to our Year 6 leaders.

The Year 1 group of Extension Writers have co constructed a letter to Newcastle Council on why green spaces are important in our local area. They presented a point of view in their letter about how parks provide a space for flora and fauna as well as a space and for children to build strong muscles. Everyone described in detail their favourite equipment at their local park. This topic linked to their Geography unit, so students coud connect their learning which resulted in rich discussions. 
To begin with, our school is the best because you can play at the sandpit, the equipment and spend alone time reading a book at the library.
