#### Assistant Principal's Message

#### **Child Protection Week**

National Child Protection started today and runs for the week. The theme for 2023 is "Where we start matters" and the logo is the jigsaw puzzle attached. This highlights that the safety of children is from their connections to adults all around them – we are all pieces of their jigsaw puzzle. Throughout this week, each class will focus on activities related to child protection, we also start our child protection week unit of work. Over the course of the week, talk to your child about ways to keep safe, such as stranger danger, cyber safety and keeping our bodies safe. Throughout this week, I will post links to useful websites on Compass.

#### Child Protection Information from the Catholic Schools Office

NCSS 3.2.2 Safeguarding information is provided and widely available, including contact details of the Safeguarding Committee and/or Safeguarding Coordinator(s).

#### Safeguarding information for parents

The Catholic Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle has an absolute and abiding commitment to promote the safety, welfare, and wellbeing of children. As a parent sending your child or children to a Diocesan school, you should be aware of your rights and obligations in protecting your child and all children in our schools.

St Therese's has implemented a Safeguarding Promoter to ensure that our families are provided with information about the school's approach to safeguarding children and its compliance with the Church and State child safe Standards. Kaylene Maretich is currently in this position.

#### The Children and Young Person's (Care and Protection) Act 1998

In NSW we can report certain information to the Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ). If we are concerned for one or more of the children in the school, we can discuss our concerns with a teacher, Assistant Principal or Principal. We can report our concerns to the Child Protection Helpline (Ph. 132 111, 24 hrs/7 days) if we have reasonable grounds to suspect that a child or young person is at risk of significant harm and our concerns are current. Risk of significant harm may occur from a single act or omission or to a series of acts or omissions.

When determining how serious your concerns for a child may be, always consider whether that child has any particular risk factors, including:

- age, the younger the more dependent
- physical disabilities, developmental delays, or medical conditions
- social isolation
- culturally diverse background
- diverse sexuality and gender
- nobody looking out for the child they could depend on.

It is better to be safe than sorry, so if uncertain, talk to a staff member at the school.

As parents you are entitled to contact the Office of Safeguarding directly about any concerns you have about the safety, welfare or wellbeing of a child or if you are concerned that the school is not addressing allegations of reportable conduct or abuse. (Ph. 4979 1390 Mon-Fri).

#### Art Trail

We invite all families to the Art Trail on **Friday 15 September** from 3:30 – 5:30pm in the school grounds. The trail will begin from the Royal St gates, closest to the Kindergarten classrooms, and will meander through the school. You can pick up a map as you enter the gates, which will show you where all the artworks are installed. The map contains QR codes, that can be scanned on your phone, to access podcasts recorded by students in each grade that explain the artworks. We will also have computers with the audio files, as a back up to play the podcasts. Year 6 will also hold a cake stall, where delicious treats can be purchased, the money raised will go towards the Year 6 end of year celebrations. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the following, people who have made the Art Trail possible: Odette and Luke Tonkin, Cathy and John Walker, Carla Ladmore, Jan Cristaudo and Mr Ward and his Jazz band. #### **Religious Education**

**Staff Faith Formation** — This Friday, 8<sup>th</sup> September, is a Pupil-Free Day as our staff engage in a Spirituality & Faith Formation day. The theme of the day will be, *Rediscovering Joy: Finding Wonder & Joy in The Word of God*, and will be delivered by special guest visitor Dr Michelle Connolly. Formation is a deep, experiential and transformational learning journey of head, heart and hands that nurtures both individual spiritual growth and communal flourishing. As an ecclesial (Church) endeavour and part of the evangelising mission of the Catholic Church, Catholic schools in the Maitland-Newcastle diocese seek to develop an atmosphere of faith, in which teachers, students and families are valued and know they are valued as persons of worth and dignity, created in the image and likeness of God. Formation encourages the growth of the whole person which nurtures their way of being in the world, their communion with God, themselves, others and creation and invites all to a greater calling as missionary disciples in the service of others.

School and system leaders, as well as all staff members, need ongoing formation in order to grow in their own understanding of and capacity for, the ministry that is Catholic education.

#### WHAT DOES FORMATION LOOK LIKE?

- Formation is experienced through a range of deliberate and circumstantial processes. In other words, formation happens through intentionally planned experiences, as well as incidentally, through the culture and relationships within the community.
- Formation requires the setting aside of 'chronos' time away from the daily routine of school life to enable 'Kairos' time for God to work in the midst of the experience.
- It is intended to be lifelong. No one is completely 'formed'. Everyone is on their own pathway and at different stages on their journey.
- It can be facilitator-led or not. Programs such as Staff formation/spirituality days, retreats, staff groups, through to reading, personal reflection and experiences. There is no one way to experience formation.
- It is an experience of encounter with God, that affirms an individual's understanding of themselves as a person made in God's image and likeness and in an ongoing, life-giving relationship with the creator, led by the Holy Spirit.
- An experience that seeks to equip individuals and communities with greater clarity of purpose and sense of their role in God's mission on earth (the fulfilment of God's Kingdom of love, justice, peace, mercy and care for creation)

Dear Families,

The Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle and its schools are individually and collectively committed to partnering with families to co-develop faith-filled learning environments in which students flourish.

Family engagement forums, including Parent Engagement Groups (PEG), play a key role in fostering a sense of belonging and support for all in our school communities.

As you may be aware, your school's PEG was only established in recent years, and was done so to support authentic family engagement in student learning. Recently, the Trustees of the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle have endorsed a recommendation that all diocesan schools transition to the PEG model by 31 December 2025. The evolution to a single-family engagement model is in response to the declining engagement of families in official school forums across the Diocese and recognises the importance of consistency.

In addition, the Trustees have accepted a subsequent recommendation that schools' PEG forums be renamed Family and Community Engagement (FACE). This name change recognises that school engagement is larger than just parents and highlights our Catholic schools' inclusive nature. Furthermore, the acronym FACE is a symbolic representation that the Church views families and community as being at the forefront of schools.

With change comes opportunity for improvement. As part of the transition process, the Trustees have tasked the Diocesan Governance Team to develop a strengthened framework for the FACE model in consultation with key stakeholder groups, including families.

Accordingly, I have begun discussions with the Diocese's peak parent body, the Federation of P & F Associations to ensure that parents and carers have a strong voice in informing the refreshed family engagement forum guidelines. Next week, I will be meeting with Federation delegates to understand their hopes and aspirations for the FACE model, and to collaboratively identify methods to engage all families regarding the improved model.

Of uppermost importance in this process will be ensuring that the FACE model supports improved outcomes for students and enables parents and carers to be authentically engaged in their child's education.

Further details about the transition process, including consultation opportunities will be made available in due course, following meetings with Federation of P & F Association delegates. In the interim, I understand you may have suggestions regarding how family engagement forums including the existing PEG model could be strengthened, and I encourage you to send them through to info@mn.catholic.edu.au



I am hopeful that by continuing to work together, we can strengthen family and community engagement in our schools and thus, continue to build a positive and supportive environment for students to grow and learn. Yours sincerely,
