Extra Sports Day

Religious Education

RE News

<u>Staff Faith Formation</u> – Last Friday, our staff engaged in a Diocesan System Formation Day titled – "*Rediscovering Joy: Finding Wonder & Joy in the Word of God.*" It was led by Dr Michelle Connolly RSJ, and the essence of the day was around a deeper understanding of scripture. As a biblical scholar, Dr Connolly, talked about the importance of understanding the historical, sociological and literary contexts in which these ancient sacred texts were written. Staff then had the opportunity to engage with several passages from the Bible to analyse and discuss these in further detail according to the '*Scripture Reading Strategy*' presented on the day.

Faith Formation essentially takes place in 3 domains: *Formation of the Heart* (through personal, reflective and prayerful encounter with God), *Formation of the Head* (through undertaking deeper study and knowledge of the faith), and *Formation of the Hands* (through experiential engagement in mission activities). The understanding is that each one of these domains can lead us into a deeper encounter with God and that indeed a balanced approach of all three helps enliven and enrich our personal and communal faith life.

Last Friday was very much a Formation of the Head experience. It cannot be underestimated how important this is as we continue to not only teach our children Religious Education but as we continue to lead and guide them in the faith in a modern world which often challenges



or seems to contradict many of the scriptures – deeming them irrelevant to contemporary human beings and society. Through accurate analysis and understanding of their original context and meaning, however, it becomes possible for us to not only read these ancient sacred passages but to help enliven them with a sense of eternal newness, wonder and joy for both our children and ourselves. In this way, the Bible then truly becomes *The Living Word of God*.



Lillian's Piano Studio is back in St Therese after time off due to COVID and are ready to do what we do best. Limited spots available so please get in early.


