
Bishop's Visit

Assistant Principal's Message

Progressive Achievement Testing (PAT)

Next week all children in Years 1-6 will complete the Progressive Achievement Testing (PAT) as follows:

- PAT Reading Years 1-6
- PAT Maths Years 1-6
- PAT Grammar and Punctuation Years 3-6

As PAT is completed yearly in early November, it allows us to look at the growth in children across the year. We also look at the trends in data, so that as a school we set our focus for 2024. In early 2024, teachers then spend time looking at the PAT data, so that we know where to target teaching. Children do not need to "study" for PAT, it is one of the many assessments we use to gauge an understanding of where your child is at with the learning. Flexible groups in English and Maths will not occur next week, to allow for PAT to be administered.

Children in Years 1 -3 will use the school devices to do their testing and children in Years 4-6 will use their own devices. Please ensure your child charges their device each day and brings their device to school each day. The school does not have a bank of "back up" devices for Year 4-6 to use.

The teachers have completed the class lists for 2024 and Learning Support teachers and the Leadership Team are now reviewing the lists. Please do not send any further considerations for classes for 2024. Classes for 2024 will be sent home with your child when the reports are released on Friday 8 December.

<u>Pedagogy of Encounter: The new RE Curriculum continues to roll out in 2024</u> – Over the past couple of years, the Catholic Schools Office have been committed to rewriting our diocesan Religious Education Curriculum. This new curriculum is known as the Pedagogy of Encounter. Kindergarten and Year 1 currently employ this new curriculum in the classroom and, as of 2024, Year 2 and Year 3 will also be implementing the Pedagogy of Encounter.

The vision of this new curriculum is that the Good News of Jesus Christ be encountered in every RE classroom in innovative and co-creative ways as part of the living tradition of the Church, as a system of meaning and relevance to individuals' social and community experience. The Vision for the new Religious Education curriculum appropriately aligns with the diocesan Vision statement where Jesus Christ is the heart of all we do. The RE curriculum seeks to invite students into a knowledge and experience of Jesus who invites them into relationship with God and reveals God's love to them.



How will this occur?

Encountering the mystery of God through a Pedagogy of Encounter.


- ➤ The Pedagogy of Encounter is about encountering the mystery of God through the mystery of everyday life.
- > Students are invited to depth their own views on matters being studied and to engage with the perspectives of others and of the Catholic Church.
- > The Pedagogy invites students to do more than just learn facts or content about the topics being studied; it invites them to reflect on the meaning that those facts have for them and to attend to the significance of that meaning for their way of being in the world.
- ➤ The Pedagogy challenges students to consider how the learning process has called them into action or into a new way of seeing and critiquing the world and a new way of being in it.

This pedagogy will inform the new programs in terms of structuring learning opportunities.

This will be facilitated through a dialogical model that responds to the different voices within the RE classroom.

"Dialogue, in fact, educates when the person relates with respect, esteem and sincere listening, and is expressed with authenticity without obscuring or softening one's own identity nourished by evangelical inspiration." (Pope Francis 2017)

For many children and teens, big feelings will drive big behaviour, which can be confusing and challenging for them and the adults who care for them. The more we understand the what, why, and how of feelings and the behaviours they fuel, the more we will be able to respond to teens (and ourselves) more effectively and compassionately. Ultimately, our responses will nurture the vital foundations of self-regulation in children and their capacity to feel and express the full range of human emotions in healthy ways.

The session will explore:

- where big feelings come from and why they have an important job to do;
- · why children depend on their important adults to provide calm during their emotional storms, and how to do this:
- · the four broad reasons for emotional dysregulation and how to respond:
- · practical ways to help children and teens understand feelings and why this matters;
- a new way to understand big feelings and the big. behaviours they fuel;
- · practical strategies to deal with challenging behaviour;
- changing the way we think about discipline why traditional disciplines don't work and what to do instead:
- how to build relationships with teens that will preserve our connection and influence:
- connection after conflict how to repair after an emotional or relational 'collision' with children:
- . brain to brain how to use our own capacity to self-requiate as the circuit breaker for big feelings and big behaviour:
- when behaviour is extra big the common origins of big behaviour, how to respond in the moment, and the practical strategies that will effect lasting change;
- how to establish meaningful boundaries with love and leadership, and how to respond when those boundaries are challenged;
- . building their emotional toolbox the strategies that will build their capacity to tolerate big feelings and respond more effectively.

ABOUT: KAREN YOUNG began her career as a psychologist working extensively with children, teens and families. She is a sought-after speaker and consultant and is the founder of "Hey Sigmund", an Internationally popular online resource that provides contemporary, research driven information on anxiety. She is the author of four books, including the bestselling 'Hey Warrior', which creatively assist children to understand and manage anxiety.
