Acting Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers

It's Week 6, can you believe how fast this term is going? I know many children are already looking forward to end of year events, but we encourage them to focus on each day, and all the fun and experiences each day brings.

Morning Drop Off

We continue to have many children being dropped off at school as early as 7:45am, this morning we had over 50 children at school by 8:15am. St Nicholas OOSH is available for families that need to drop their child/ren off before supervision at school commences at 8:45am. We have had increasing numbers of children arriving at school very early, which is unsafe, as there may be no-one at school should an accident occur. While some staff arrive early, it is to plan for the day, to meet with colleagues or to contact parents. However, they are needing to go out to the playground as many children who arrive early are climbing on tables, jumping the fences, or playing on the playground unsupervised. There may be times where you may need to drop your child/ren off a bit earlier than 8:45am, children are then required to put their bags outside their classroom and sit in the shade outside the Catherine McAuley Centre.

Christmas Activity Day

On Friday 1 December, we have organised Christmas Activities for all the children between 12-2pm. There are 24 different activities, run across two sessions:

Session 1: 12:15 – 1:00pmSession 2: 1:15 – 2:00pm

Children will return to their classroom between each session. The activities from Session 1 will be repeated in Session 2. Each child will be able to choose **one** activity in Session 1 and **one** activity in Session 2. Your child does **not** need to only do activities run by their class teacher; they can choose to do any activity they think they would like. A Message from Pope Francis as we Move Towards Christmas – The following piece, written by Nick Brodie, is a nice summation of Pope Francis' reflection on Sunday's Gospel passage (*Matt 25:1-13*) The Parable of The Ten Bridesmaids, and serves as a reminder of what Christianity is all about as we move closer towards Christmas and the coming of Christ:

Reflecting on this Gospel passage, Pope Francis affirms that 'Jesus wants to tell us that we must be prepared for the encounter with him'. Jesus gives a pretty blunt message of preparedness, after all: 'stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour".

But the Pope reminds us that this readiness of which Jesus speaks is not meant to be just for 'the final encounter'. Jesus wants us to be ready, as the Pope puts it, 'for the everyday great and small encounters'. Jesus wants us to be prepared by being wakeful. That means being alert and active.

As Pope Francis further reminds us, the lamps symbolise faith and the oil symbolises charity. We might therefore ask ourselves whether and how we prepare our lamps of faith to shine? Do we see Jesus in the poor, the sick, the lonely, the forgotten peoples of this world, and act accordingly? Or do we sleepily wander through life fixated only on the final encounter, slowly letting the oil of charity run dry and the lamp of faith grow dim?


