This week we focus on **Dealing with Disappointment**

As young people learn to navigate through various aspects of their life, they may face disappointment due to unfulfilled expectations, shattered dreams, or unexpected setbacks. Yet, with the appropriate tools, strategies, and a positive mindset, young people can learn to cope with disappointment and use it as an opportunity for personal growth and success.

Disappointment can be a tricky emotion to deal with at any age. It is a normal part of growing up. However, children sometimes need reminding that they have a choice in how they respond to disappointment and their response will determine the impact it has on their future happiness. Overall, disappointment is a healthy and positive emotion and plays an integral part in a child's emotional, intellectual and social development.

Helping young people manage their disappointment is important in order to avoid stronger emotions such as anxiety and depression. Although a parent's first reaction may be to fix the problem, it is better to encourage your child to find the words to express how they feel.

In this Special Report, parents and caregivers are provided with strategies on how to help their child process disappointment and look at the problem objectively.

Pope Francis says something that echoes John's approach. In one of his apostolic exhortations he encourages us as follows: 'Your life ought to be a prophetic stimulus to others to leave a mark on this world.' What Pope Francis means is that we are all meant to be voices in the wildernesses of our time.



During Advent, therefore, we are all called to be welcoming voices singing a prophetic tune. As Pope Francis has often encouraged us, we should be good stewards for all creation. Christians should take the lead in caring for the earth and the poor who inhabit it. Similarly, the Pope has encouraged us to be a synodal people, learning to walk and talk together in harmony as the People of God. Christians should not cling to divisive nostalgias, but cherish what matters and face the future with openness and confidence.

School Medication

Please ensure that any changes to your child's medication is notified in writing and that you receive a reply from the office within 48 hours. If you don't hear from us please contact us immediately. We are in the process of updating our Administration of Medication procedures and this will be communicated to the school community in due course.

School Fees

For those families who do not have a payment arrangement in place, please note that the balance of 2023 School fees are now due. Please arrange for payment to be made by the end of November.

Year 6 parents are reminded to check their fees are up to date to ensure a fee clearance for their new high school.

Compass attendance notes

Please be aware that adding attendance notes in Compass if for WHOLE DAY absences. If you are bringing your child to school late due to an appointment etc, you will receive the text message. Please disregard this if the child is with you. Then upon bringing them into the admin office, you will sign them in through the kiosk. This then adjusts the class roll in real time.

Also, if you are collecting your child early for some reason, please DO NOT add a note in advance, just call into the office and sign them out through the kiosk.

Gifted Education News Term 4

Congratulations to our Virtual Academy students; Harry N, Phoebe M, Rose H, Eden H, Sage T and Anna V who presented their final projects to a virtual audience across the diocese. Their commitment and dedication to the program has been outstanding. Their chosen topics were.

Phoebe M- Maintaining respectful friendships. Phoebe created a Powerpoint and Kahootz on this topic and interviewed her peers to gauge current issues that arise with friendships.

Harry N- Created a puppet show video for children about how to stay safe if there is a break in at home. Harry investigated current statistics around the world on this issue. He researched various sources as to how to act safely if this happens.

Anna V- Investigated the importance of eating fruit and vegetables in season to reduce food wastage and help the environment. Anna surveyed class members to gauge their understanding of the benefits of eating seasonal fruit and vegetables. She was able to teach her peers about the environmental benefits of eating fresh produce which is in season.

Sage T- Researched Climate Change and its impact on our natural environment. Sage created a Kahootz to survey classmates about their knowledge of Climate Change. She investigated the everyday activities we can all do to make a difference to mitigate the effects of climate change.

Rose H- Studied and researched gender inequality and forms of discrimination. Rose critically analysed examples in history of discrimination against women in areas such as technology, sport and literature.

Eden H-Investigated plastic and oil pollution in our marine environments. Eden surveyed class members to test their knowledge of this issue. She created a video about the impact of this pollution on marine ecosystems to educate her peers about this topic.
