#### Acting Principal's Message

Dear Parents & Carers

This week starts Lent, which commemorates the 40 days that Jesus Christ spent in the desert, in prayer and fasting. This Church season begins on Ash Wednesday, which we celebrated today with a parish Mass in our school hall. Traditionally, we have "given up" treats for Lent such as chocolates, but I would like is all to focus on the practice of Catholic traditions such as saying a prayer of thanks before a meal, or on acts of service or kindness towards others. As we enter this very special time in our Catholic year, we also look inwards to ways we can connect more deeply with God, through prayer and reflection. We also invite families to attend Mass at St Therese's Church on Sundays at 9:15am.

We invite all families to join us at our Opening School Mass next **Monday 19 February** at 9:30am. Our student leadership will be presented with their badges at this Mass.

#### **Acting Assistant Principal's Message**

#### **NAPLAN**

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be held from the 13 March - 25 March this year. All students in Years 3 and 5 complete the NAPLAN in the following areas:

- Reading
- Writing
- Conventions of Language
- Numeracy.

Children complete NAPLAN online, except for the writing test for Year 3, which is completed in a booklet. The results of the tests allow us to identify and celebrate student achievement, and additionally we use the data to identify where we as a school are using effective strategies and programs in our teaching of English and Mathematics. Parents in Years 3 & 5 will receive a parent letter about NAPLAN in the coming

days.

#### Caritas Diocesan Launch: **Project Compassion**

On Tuesday, the School Captains and Councillors, along with Mrs Maretich and Mr Konik, went to the Caritas: Project Compassion launch at Sacred Heart Cathedral in Hamilton. The theme for Project Compassion this year is 'For All Future Generations' money raised and specifically go towards projects in Australia, Samoa and Malawi. Fees – We are in the process of completing the 2024 billing. #### Compass attendance notes

Please disregard this if the child is with you. Then upon bringing them into the admin office, you will sign them in through the kiosk. This then adjusts the class roll in real time.


We have a limit of 30 students. All students that were members of the Poetry Club last year will automatically continue if they wish to.
